You can begin your path towards a degree in Criminal and Social Justice while working towards your high school graduation! CHS has partnered with Middlesex Community College to offer students a variety of dual enrollment courses, taught by vetted adjunct faculty at CHS.

CHS students can enroll in Dual Enrollment courses and only pay a reduced tuition. There are no fees or book costs associated with any of our Dual Enrollment courses.

We offer all **first semeste**r required courses of a degree in Criminal and Social Justice at Middlesex Community College. This early access would allow you to complete your associate's degree in this field in just a year and a half after high school graduation. At CHS you benefit from a reduced tuition rate offered only to dual enrollment students (\$126/credit). There are no additional fees. You do not need to buy any textbooks.

- The current cost of 1 semester (tuition/fees) at Middlesex Community College is: \$6100
- The current cost of 1 semester at UMASS Lowell (tuition/fees) is: \$8285 (does not including books/housing/food)
- The current cost of 1 semester at UMASS Amherst (tuition/fees) is: \$9373 (does not include books/housing/food)

All earned credits will transfer to all Massachusetts Public Colleges and Universities through the Mass Transfer Program barring meeting the minimum grade requirements.
