The Chair welcomed all and stated that the meeting will be recorded and televised by Chelmsford Telemedia.

Consent Agenda

1. Approval of the minutes of the regular school committee meeting of August 20, 2019

Mr. Moses motioned to approve the minutes of the school committee meeting of August 20, 2019. Ms. Newcomb seconded. Motion carries 5-0.

CHS Student Representatives Announcements

The Committee welcome Sudeep Gubbala from CHS as one of the two new student representatives for the upcoming year. He announced the arrival of a new minibus for use for small groups and clubs to use for travel. There will only be three home football games this season. CHS will host the first student dance on September 21st. There will be an Activities Fair for the incoming freshmen that will highlight student clubs and other opportunities. CHS will be having a PRIDE Block which will be held in the middle of the school day and will give students opportunity to meet with their teachers for assistance. The incoming freshmen have all received a Chrome Book for school and home use. The high school students are happy that this year they will be able to park their cars in the students parking lot for free!

Good News

Dr. Hirsch reported that the opening of school has gone well with lots of excitement shown. Chrome Books have been given to all the fifth-grade students this year and their use at the middle schools is off to a good start. Audrey Rice, who was an eighth-grade student at McCarthy last year, won the National Writing Contest sponsored by *Scope Magazine* for an essay she wrote about the fall of the Berlin Wall. The CHS marching band had their first performance of the season and featured music by Bruno Mars. Congratulations are sent to the all the staff and students of the band for a great performance.

New Business

1. Announcement of Special Education Administrative Chairperson: Ms. Shawna Mottram

Ms. Mottram will be the new chairman of special education at CHS. The Committee welcomed her warmly and she stated that "everything has been great so far".

2. Announcement of Communications and Media Director: Ms. Jodie Luksha

Ms. Luksha joins the District to help with communication strategy, social media, and public relations. She is happy to be here and was warmly welcomed by The Committee.

3. Presentation: Elementary Enrichment Pilot Program

Katie Sims, Department Coordinator for Health and Physical Education and Consumer Science, joined Robin Adams from Community Education and Stephanie Quinn, Coordinator for Social Studies to give a slide show presentation on this pilot program which will take place at South Row Elementary School. This will have an initial run of seven weeks after school enrichment which may include: gardening; Zumba; karate; journaling; coding; robotics; games and creative arts. Volunteers will be needed to keep the pricing at \$30 for the initial session. If successful, the program will be expanded to include the other three elementary schools. For additional information on this program please view the entire presentation by watching tonight's meeting on You Tube.

4. Acceptance of Donation/Gift from the Hoyt Foundation

Dr. Lang's memorandum and attachment in tonight's packet provides information on a donation of almost \$50,000 worth of adaptive physical education equipment to the Chelmsford School District for the CHIPS Program. "The Hoyt Foundation aspires to build the individual character, self-confidence and self-esteem of America's disabled young people through the inclusion in all facets of daily life; including in family and community activities, especially sports, at home, in schools, and in the workplace."

Mr. Moses motioned to recommend the school committee vote to accept the donation/gift of approximately \$50,000 worth of equipment from The Hoyt Foundation, as presented in the spreadsheet contained in tonight's agenda packet, to benefit the students enrolled in the CHIPS Program. Ms. Newcomb seconded. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carries 5-0.

Dr. Lang will send a thank you letter to The Hoyt Foundation on behalf of the District.

5. Opening of School Report (verbal)

Dr. Lang shared that there was a smooth opening to school this year. Some of The Committee were able to come to opening day with the staff at the PAC. It was nice to have the teachers and support staff come together at the end of the summer and then to spend time at their individual schools in preparation for receiving the students the following day. Dr. Lang appreciated starting before Labor Day this year. Parking lot work was finished in time for the opening of school, providing extra access for parents to drop off their children. Two of the three cleaning companies were rehired for the next three years. A new company was hired to service the two middle schools. Staff were very pleased with the cleanliness of the schools on opening day. Updated security was added to both middle schools. Bus pass registration went well this summer.

6. 2019/20 Draft School Committee/Superintendent Goals

Tonight's packet contains a draft of the Committee/Superintendent goals for the new school year. These goals and action steps were updated during an August workshop held with The Committee and administration. The goals and action steps are clearly defined. Suggestions were made for changes to the draft. Ms. Santos through her memorandum, distributed at tonight's meeting, requested changes be made in the language for the "diversity goal". Her statement will be added to goal #2 before the next meeting. The Chair will update and send the updated draft to The Committee for action to be taken at the next meeting. Dr. Lang stressed that the new strategic plan for the next three or five years will be a large undertaking this year. The strategic plan will align with the proposed budget plan for the 2020/21 fiscal year.

7. Strategic Plan Overview and Timeline

Dr. Lang has included a proposed timeline in tonight's packet, which begins with surveys for staff, families, students and community members by mid-October and will culminate with his recommended FY21 budget presentation to The Committee on February 25, 2020. Meetings with each school's staff will be held during the early part of this school year. Additionally, Dr. Lang would like to schedule the first School Committee public forum on Tuesday, October 22, 2019. He suggests that the second public forum be held on December 10th and that the December 17th Committee meeting be cancelled. Throughout the strategic plan process the District Leadership Team (DLT) composed of more than 30 administrators will play a key role.

The Committee welcomed Katrina Janakos from CHS who joins Sudeep Gubbala as the student representatives to The School Committee for the current school year. Sudeep shared that three CHS students qualified to be National Merit Scholarship semifinalists due to their high PSAT scores. The first CHS dance will be this Saturday from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m. This week's football game will be Saturday at 3:00 instead of Friday night due to EEE in Haverhill. CHS Open House will be this Thursday from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. for parents.

Katrina reported that all three sports teams are off to a great start. The golf, swim and cross-country teams are all undefeated. All teams are required to do two community service projects, one in the school and one out in the community. The cross-country team has moved furniture for Parker. Girls on the soccer team have cleaned up the Harrington courtyard, while the boys' soccer team has cleaned up CHS.

RE: 2019 High School Spring MCAS ELA Retest Option

In the spring of 2019, the class of 2021(current juniors) took the ELA, mathematics, and science (STE) MCAS, which is administrered each year to our students as a graduation requirement that provides a competancy determination on student academics. During the ELA testing, there was a question that caused controvery throughout the state about its relevance and appropriateness to use as a test question. After much debate at the state level, Commistioner of Education Jeff Riley determined that the question was to be invalidated and not factored into student scores.

At the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education request, an independent study was completed by Stanford researechers to determine the impact of the question, and the possible effects of student exposure to this test question and their performance on the remaining portions of the test. Although the researchers concluded that there was minimal impact, it was still decided that students may have been impacted for scholarship purposes, specifically, the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship. Therefore students that took the spring, 2019 ELA MCAS containing the invalid question and who also scored proficient or higher on Mathematics and Science (STE) MCAS are being allowed to retake the ELA test in November for potential qualification of the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship if they feel as though they were impacted by the question during the ELA MCAS test from spring, 2018.

Principal Murray is sending the attached letter to notify parents of affected students about the availability of the ELA MCAS retake. In addition, the high school administration will call an assembly students to explain, in person, about this retake opportunity. Additional details can be found in Principal Murray's parent letter.

Dear Parents and Guardians:

This week, the Grade 10 Next-generation MCAS results were released by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). This past spring 2019, students participated in the ELA portion of this computer-based, Next-Generation MCAS. Shortly thereafter, the state received reports of a controversial essay question, and it was decided by the Commissioner of Education, Jeff Riley, to invalidate and not score this question into final student test results.

Because of this discrepancy, DESE asked Stanford researchers to conduct an independent investigation of this controversial essay question to determine if this question had any impact on the fairness of the exam for students. It was determined that the magnitude of the question overall was extremely small. However, in an abundance of caution, DESE is allowing affected students to retake the ELA test in November for potential qualification of the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship. The Department wants to ensure fairness for potential scholarship eligibility and wishes to offer a retest opportunity to any student who felt this particular question had a negative effect on the remainder of their exam.

You are receiving this letter because your student's name is on a list compiled by DESE of students that took the ELA MCAS with the invalid question and who also scored proficient or higher on Mathematics and Science (STE) MCAS that qualifies them as potential John and Abigail Adams Scholarship recipients.

For those of you unfamiliar with the John and Abigail Adams scholarship, please review the criteria below:

In order to be eligible students must:

- score at the Advanced performance level on one of the three high school MCAS tests in ELA, Mathematics, or STE (Biology, Chemistry, Introductory Physics, or Technology/Engineering); **AND**
- score at the Proficient level or higher on the remaining two high school MCAS tests; AND
- have combined scores from the three MCAS tests that place them in the top 25 percent of students in the graduating class in their district.

Students who qualify for the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship will receive award letters in the fall of their senior year. This award entitles students to a tuition credit for up to eight semesters to a Massachusetts State College or University. This scholarship covers tuition only and does not cover fees or room and board. (i.e. UMass Lowell yearly "tuition only" is approximately \$1500)

It is important to note that the ELA retest opportunity is a paper-based legacy exam and is administered for three consecutive days that are determined by the state. The test is untimed; however, students generally spend three or more hours testing per day.

Please contact your Principal Murray at murraysd@chelmsford.k12.ma.us by 2:00 p.m. on Friday, October 4th if you would like your student to participate in the retest. There will be no extensions to the October 4th deadline, as we have to order tests for students from **DESE**. If we do not hear from you by the end of the school day on **October 4th** we will assume you wish to not have your student participate.

Our school counselors, deans, and I would also be happy to discuss the options available to your student surrounding these circumstances and their individual eligibility. Please feel free to contact us directly.

Joanna Johnson-Collins and I met last week with Mr. Roger Hatch, retired MA DESE school finance administrator, to discuss contracting for his services to work with the district to author a report detailing how the state funding formula (Ch. 70 aid) affects school finances in Chelmsford, historically, at the present time, and looking into the future in light of pending legislation at the state level. 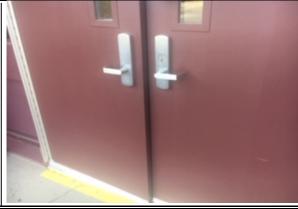

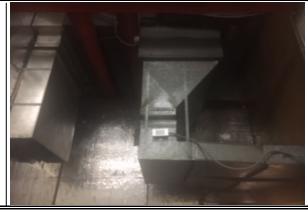
