CHELMSFORD SCHOOL COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING January 22, 2019 Meeting Minutes

Members Present: Mr. Dennis King (Chair), Mr. Al Thomas (Vice Chair), Ms. Donna Newcomb (Secretary), Mr. John Moses and Ms. Barbara Skaar

Also present: Dr. Jay Lang (Superintendent), Dr. Linda Hirsch and Ms. Joanna Johnson-Collins (Director of Business and Finance)

Mr. King opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. and led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Tonight's meeting is being televised and recorded by Chelmsford Telemedia. This session is being reopened after an Executive Session was held on school security.

Consent Agenda

1. Approval of the minutes of the regular school committee meeting of January 8, 2019.

Mr. Thomas motioned to approve the minutes of the School Committee meeting of January 8, 2019. Mr. Moses seconded. Motion carries 4-0 with Ms. Skaar abstaining.

CHS Student Representative Announcements

Clare shared that semester two started today at CHS. On February 25 and 26, 2019, the CHS Theater Guild will present *Our Town*. There will be an early release day on February 6, 2019.

Kate stated that MCAS testing will be on February 5th and 6th. On February 7th there will be a meeting in the PAC at 6:30 for eighth grade parents. Congratulations to Matthew Waterman who earned a 36 composite score on his ACT, which is a huge achievement.

Good News

Byam School kicked off "Reading Rocks" enrichment which supports their winter reading challenge. At Parker three teachers have created a new program called "Parker Perks". Every other Friday a coffee hour is held from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. This allows students in specialized programs to gain valuable communication skills. CHS has received ten Lenovo virtual reality headsets due to a grant. The new Student Help Desk started today. Students involved are either taking a course for this at CHS or were part of the "Summer Help Crew". This week the orientation for our TEA teachers will begin.

New Business

1. Chelmsford High School Alumni Association 2019 Hall of Fame Inductees

Mr. Simonian and Terry spoke of the 29th Hall of Fame induction to be held on March 23rd at the UMASS Lowell Conference Center. In addition to nine new inductees, the "Lucy E. Simonian Golden Lion Award" will be presented to Evelyn Thoren for her extraordinary support for CHS students over the years.

2. Spotlight on the Departments: Mathematics

Dr. Matthew Beyranevand, Department Coordinator for Mathematics, put together a slide show and presentation which is included in tonight's agenda packet. Mathematics teachers and coaches assisted with the presentation. Together they shared the philosophy of the department which focuses on: conceptual understanding; joyful mathematics and growth mindset. Presenters shared details of what is happening at the high school, middle school and elementary school levels.

3. Teachers for Global Classrooms (TGC) Presentation: CHS Teacher Brian Acheson

Mr. Acheson spoke of his experience with TGC this past summer. This allowed the participants to meet with teachers from other countries and focus on global and educational issues. Prior to his experience in India, he was required to take courses which were equivalent to 8 college credits. During his three weeks in India he was able to learn about the Indian culture and education system and spent one full week at a school in India. He shared informational slides and pictures highlighting his experiences. He is looking forward to the arrival on February 4, 2019, of the TEA teachers who will be spending a month here, culminating with a presentation to the School Committee on March 5th.

4. 1:1 Technology (Chromebook) Initiative

Bill Silver, Director of ICTS, provided a review of technology projects for the Chelmsford Public Schools from the summer of 2018 to the present. Additionally, he presented an update on the findings of the 1:1 Steering Committee. This initiative will allow for a 1:1 Chromebook implementation starting with grades five and nine for the 2019/2020 school year. His thorough presentation covered: the implementation planning; the vision; equitable access; consistent and adequate funding; personnel and tech support; empowering leaders; instructional framework for curriculum; student centered learning; feedback and evaluation; engaged communities and usage protocol and policies. His slides and supporting documentation are included in tonight's agenda packet and the documentation will be available on the district website. Mr. Silver's presentation was well received by the Committee. Mr. Silver addressed questions asked by members of the Committee. No Committee action is required at this time. This initiative will be included in the FY20 Budget presented by Dr. Lang at the next School Committee meeting on February 5, 2019.

5. FY19 Budget Report: 2nd Quarter Financials

Joanna Johnson-Collins, Director of Business and Finance, provided a Year-to-Date report from MUNIS on the department's financial activity through December of 2018 for the \$59M annual operating budget. Supporting documentation is included in tonight's packet. Going page by page, she explained the details of the report to the Committee. In conclusion, the district is on solid financial ground.

6. Dyslexia Screening Legislation

Dr. Hirsch spoke of the new dyslexia screening law (Chapter 272 of the Acts of 2018). Although the state protocols are not yet determined, Chelmsford has moved ahead to ask families of incoming kindergarten students if their children have any documented neurological findings. Once DESE has a screening plan in place, Dr. Hirsch will provide an update.

7. Personnel Report: December 2018

No action required.

8. Public Input: FY20 Budget Process & Priorities

Dr. Lang will be presenting his recommended FY20 budget at the next Committee meeting on February 5, 2019. The Committee discussed the possible addition of social workers to the district's staff.

Reports

1. Liaison Reports

Ms. Newcomb reported that SEPAC held a workshop last week on parental navigation of IEPs. Mr. King and Dr. Lang attended the Council of Schools meeting. Mr. King also attended the Valley Collaborative Stakeholders meeting.

Next Tuesday the public forum on scheduling will take place at the Chelmsford Police Station. The School Committee Handbook is now available on the district website.

Adjournment

Mr. Thomas motioned to adjourn tonight's School Committee meeting at 8:40 p.m. Ms. Skaar seconded. Motion carries 5-0.

Parker Homework Survey-Update

- We conducted a student homework survey last February.
- When we were here last May, we were in the process of meeting with teachers to share results.
- Students met with teachers and presented the data.
- Each of you have the grade-level presentations that the students created when they shared the results with the teachers.

Homework Survey: Takeaways

- "Teachers should communicate more with each other so that projects are not due the same day, and tests and quizzes are not on the same day" (and not give *new* homework on nights before tests.)
- "No/reduced homework on nights where there is a school sponsored event."

• Also, students would like to know their assignments for the week on Monday so they can plan better and manage their time.

• Teachers could try to check in with their students on how long it is actually taking to complete their assignments; we think teachers may underestimate this.

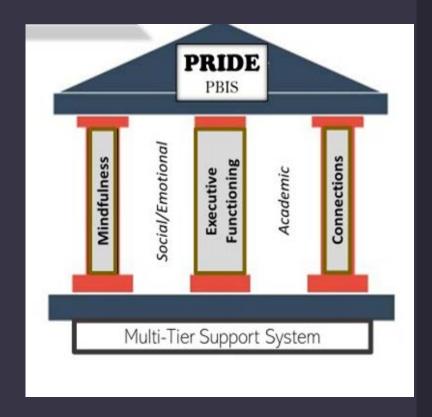

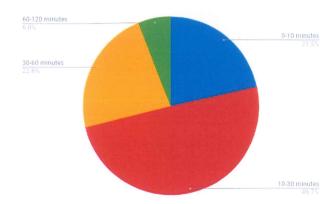

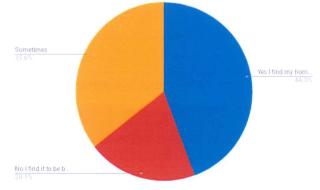

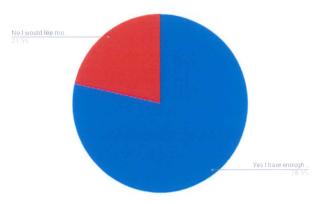

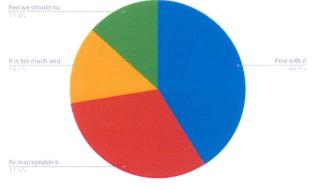

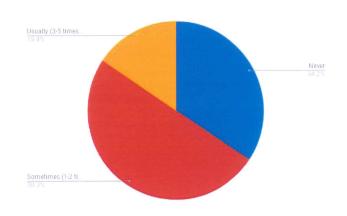

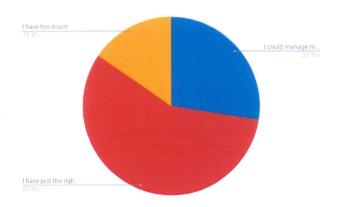
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for ELA

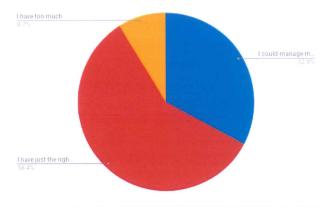
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Math

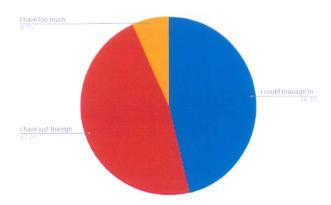
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Science

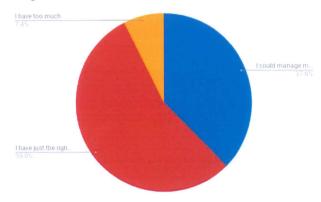
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Social Studies

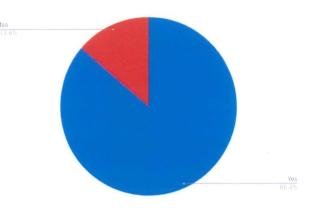

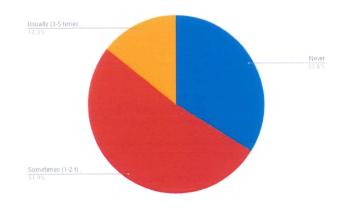

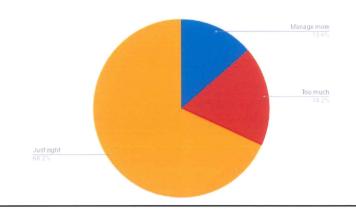
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for ELA

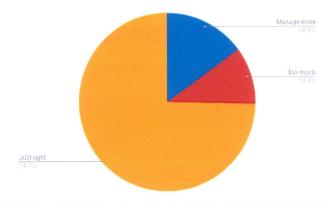
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Math

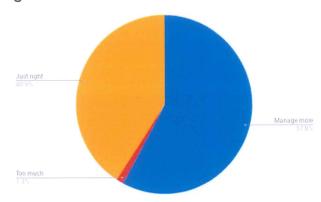
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Science

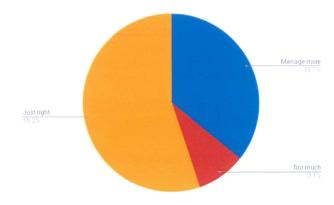
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Social Studies

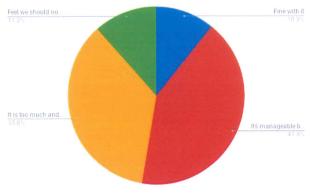

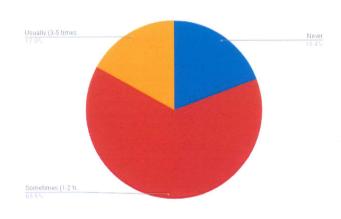

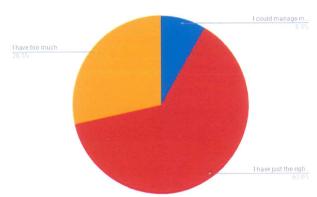

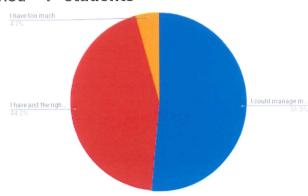
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Math

Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Science

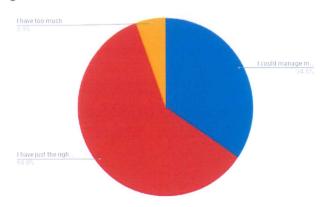

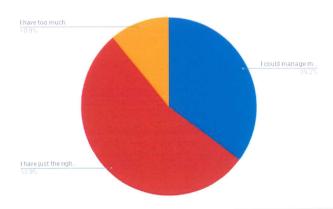
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Social Studies

Question 15: Comments from students for teachers

- Stressful- Teachers sometimes give too much homework in one night.
- Irrelevant- Lots of students mentioned that some of the homework assigned is not relevant to what they are learning in class. Work like this also takes us away from studying and doing the work that has to be done.
- Communication- Teachers should communicate to each other so they do not have a test on the same day or too much homework in each subject.

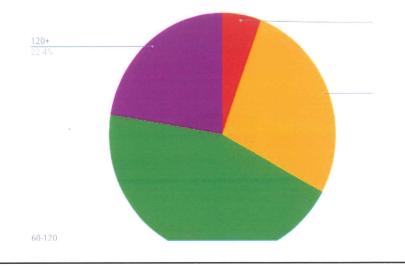

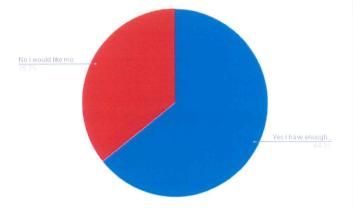

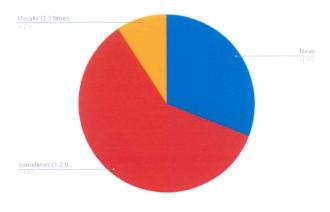

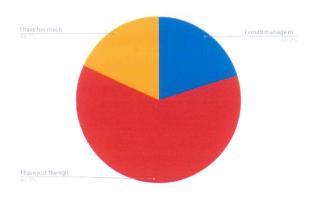
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for ELA

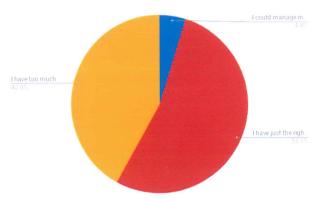
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Math

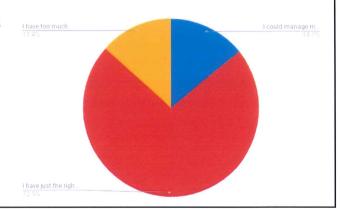
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Science

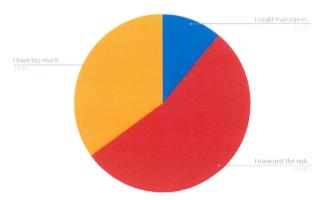
Question 13: Rate how much time you spend on most nights for Social Studies

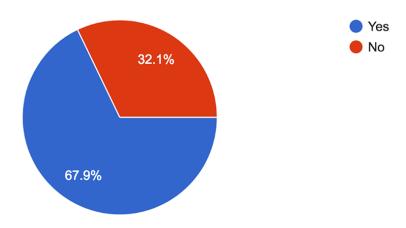

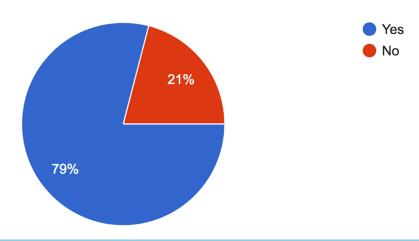

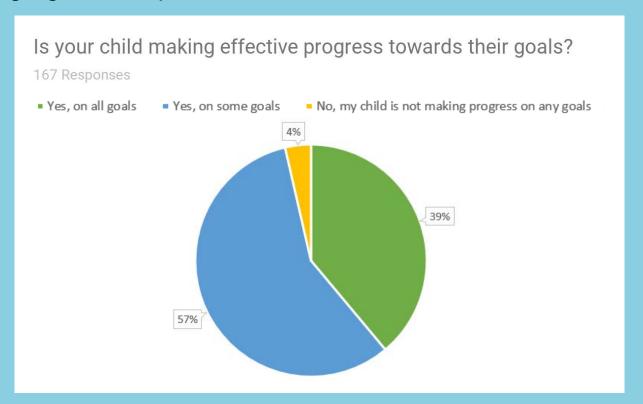

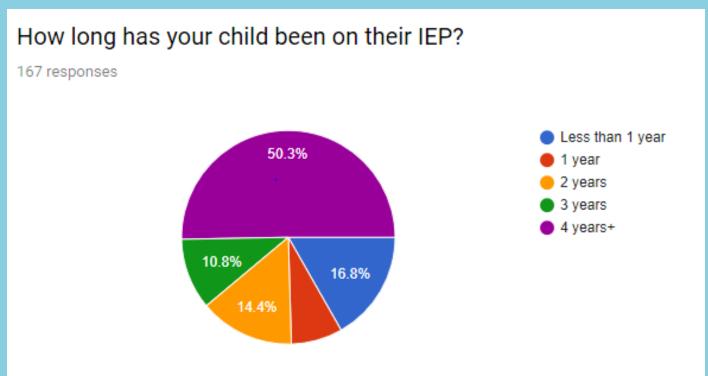

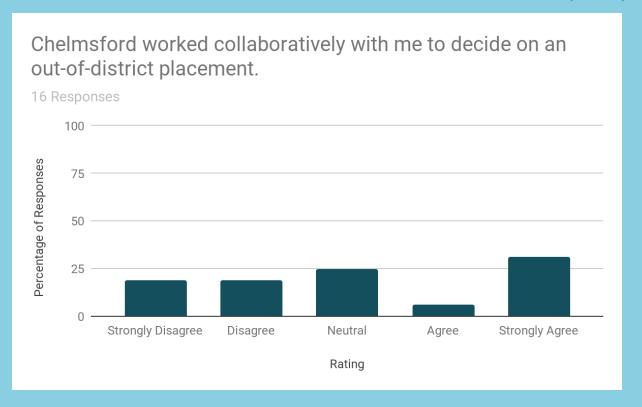

Results for families with students with Out of District Placement (OOD)



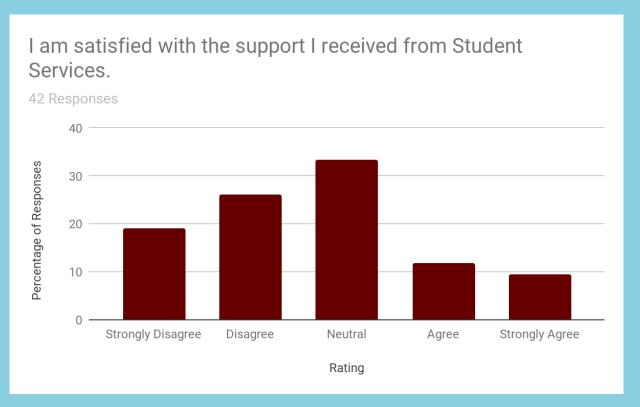

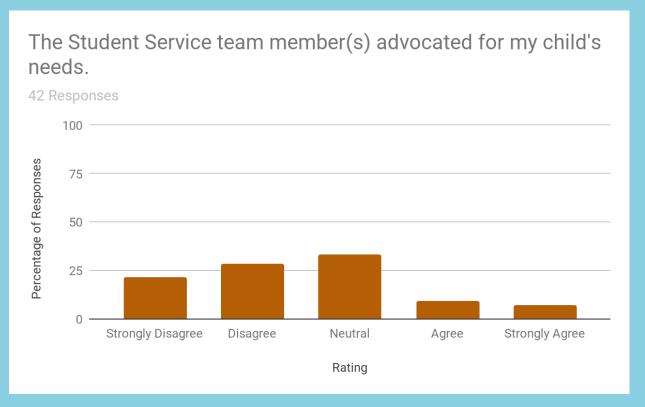

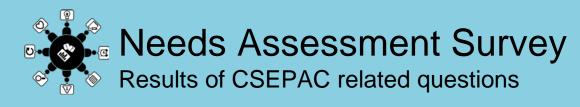

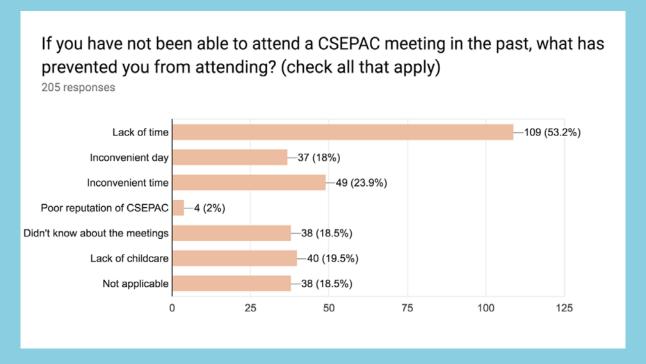

CSEPAC should investigate the possibility of airing meetings and workshops on Chelmsford TV. CSEPAC should redo the survey at least every 3 years to monitor effectiveness of these actions.

Concern: Communication within the district and to and from parents

Recommendation: CSEPAC and CPS could co-host a roundtable discussion to inform parents of how processes and timelines work for things like MTSS, SST, Title 1, IEP, and 504 Plans. The flow chart recommended on the previous slide could be presented at this event.

Chelmsford special education programing could be an exemplary model for others in the state. CSEPAC would like to help make that happen by providing objective, educated feedback to the school committee, fostering a trusting relationship between parents and the district, and providing information to parents so that they can successfully navigate the system. The feedback provided by parents in the needs assessment survey, at meetings, and from Parent Support Group updates indicates that we need to focus on two things to make that happen: communication and parent education.

CSEPAC has 4 current board Members. Alison Barnes and Kristen Eriksen are co-chairs. Laurie McCarron is secretary. Jane Zhao is treasurer. There are several parents serving as liaisons to the parent organization at their child's school. Board positions and liaison duties are outlined in the bylaws, attached. CSEPAC Responsibilities & Duties

According to the Guidelines for Special Education Parent Advisory Councils, "The PAC has authority to create bylaws to help govern its duties, including rules for election of officers. By-laws may designate operational procedures or specific policies and step s to follow in organizing activities for the PAC." Chelmsford SEPAC updated and approved bylaws with the parents of our community in November 2018.

The mission is to effectively communicate the understanding, respect, and support for all children with special education needs in our community.

Under the law, the duties of the SEPAC are defined – "advising the district on matters that pertain to the education and safety of students with disabilities; meeting regularly with school officials to participate in the planning, development, and evaluation of the school district's special education programs." 603 CMR 28:07(4) These duties are defined within our purpose:

- Advise the school committee on matters that pertain to the education and safety of students with special needs. Participate in the planning, development and evaluation of the school district's special education programs.
- Collaborate with the district to inform parents about their rights regarding special education.
- Disseminate information about programs and services in the school system.
- Help direct parents to advocacy, support services, and parent education opportunities.
- Inform parents about special education legislation.

Our line item for the 2018-19 school year was \$750. Our budget was used to provide workshops for parents. We are working on adding another workshop this spring, taught by the Federation of Children with Special Needs. That will use our remaining funds.

Additionally, our reciprocal relationship with the Byam Student Association allotted an additional \$46. BSA invited CSEPAC to run a cupcake booth at their back to school event and, in return, they split the profits with us. This has been used to provide refreshments at our events.

<u>Executive Functioning</u>: April 4, 2019, To be presented by Speech and Language Pathologist, Karen Grabowski, and Special Educator & BCBA, Kristine Wiltz. Together, they will describe executive functioning deficits and focus on how to address your child's needs at home. Tools and techniques will be offered across all grade levels.

<u>504 Plans</u>: To be planned for spring. This workshop explains the rights and responsibilities of a 504 Plan, who is eligible, what it contains, and the major differences between a 504 Plan and an IEP. This is a presentation by the Federation of Children with Special Needs.

Concerns and Recommendations

Needs Assessment Survey

This anonymous assessment survey was designed by the Chelmsford Special Education Parent Advisory Council (CSEPAC) to quantify and qualify levels of understanding and satisfaction for the services our children are receiving from the Chelmsford Public Schools. Respondents were tasked with rating their experiences and answering questions to the best of their ability. An additional directive was given to submit the survey separately for one child and then re-submit for an additional child. Respondents were told that the entirety of the survey need not be completed twice.

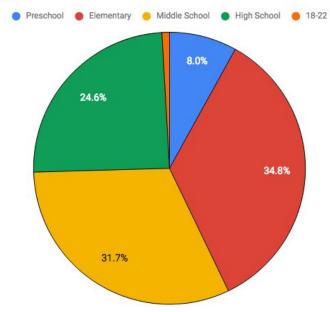
The survey was sent to 1,104 contacts and 227 contacts completed the survey which is a great response rate. This number would likely go up as families see changes and trust the process. 75% of submissions were from families with a child on an IEP and 25% of submissions were from families with a child on a 504 Plan.

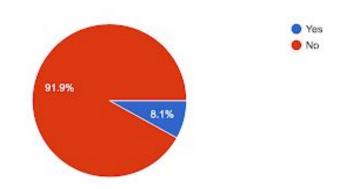
Demographics

Percentage of School



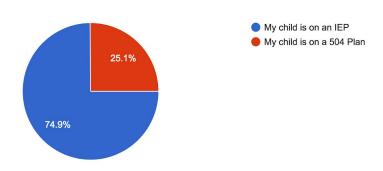
Have you already taken this survey for another child?

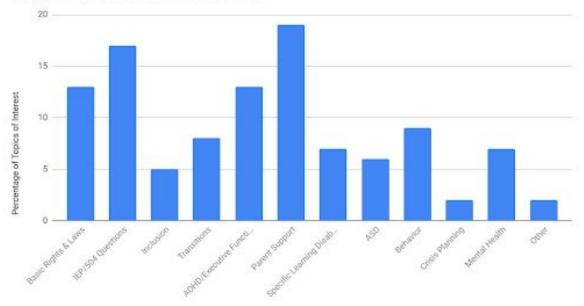

Topics of Interest for Future Workshops



Parents are most interested in workshops surrounding Parent Supports, IEP and 504 Plans, Basic Rights and Laws, ADHD/Executive Functioning, and behavior. We have access to many great presenters through the Federation, the district and town resources, and our area has some of the best researchers and practitioners in the country. The later of which cost more money to bring in, but we could look into co-hosting with a neighboring PAC for those events.

This is a recommendation that has carried over from the 2017-18 presentation. "Emails should be responded to in a timely manner to either acknowledge receipt of emails or to respond informatively. This should be modeled from the top down, starting with the director of student services."

Concern: Parents are unsure who to contact regarding implementation of 504 plans. **Recommendation**: A flow chart is created for each school outlining the hierarchy of professionals responsible for implementing the 504. Parent and teacher training on 504 plans.

This concern is carried over from the 2017-18 presentation. "Define levels of intervention, like the Response to Intervention (RTI) model, that occur before an evaluation is recommended or agreed upon when requested. The process to figure out if your child needs services is not clear. Parents need to know the timeline for trying approaches for individual needs within the general ed classroom. Parents need to know the process for seeking out and identifying children with special needs."

Concern: Need update on the items that were partially or not implemented on the Coordinated Program Review

Recommendation: CSEPAC Chairs should meet regularly with administration and school committee to review our concerns & recommendations for the district, evaluation of special education programming and services, and PAC goals.

This recommendation is carried over from the 2017-18 presentation. "Continue efforts to achieve the goals listed on the CPR. We recommend that the items listed as concerns from CPR be made a priority. We realize a lot of the efforts that go towards meeting the goals listed on the CPR are behind the scenes. It would benefit the relationship between parents and the district to make those efforts be made visible. That could be done by communicating those action during SEPAC board meetings with administration or arranging for time on a SEPAC agenda to give an update to the entire group. We would like to be able to acknowledge the efforts being done to meet those goals and be an active participant in developing special education programs."

Concern: Removing recess is part of district policy for consequences for behavior. Teachers remove recess for reasons other than those listed in the parent handbook.

Recommendation: The district could evaluate the behavior policies, districtwide and by individual teachers, related to removing recess as a punishment. Investigate how PBIS plans relate to district behavior policies and consequences.

This recommendation is carried over from the 2017-18 presentation. "Evaluate the behavior policies related to removing recess as a punishment. Punishment is a short term solution to a long term problem. Identify the cause of unwanted behaviors during lunch & recess and address those needs, rather than punishing children."

Concern: Out of District families requests for more guidance on home school community after school enrichment activity and sports options.

Recommendation: CSEPAC and CPS should continue to seek ways to include children with OOD placements in our community

This recommendation is carried over from the 2017-18 presentation. "Invite OOD families to community events. In order to help children who attend school in different districts feel connected to their community, we recommend that they be included in invitations to special events that happen at our schools. Those children still live in Chelmsford, and if at any point moving back into this district for education becomes a choice, they need to have a connection to peers and community."

 - Meet with DSS prior to sepac meetings in lieu of meeting at different times
 - Set up meetings with Administration and SC to review our concerns & recommendations for the district, and PAC goals.
- Develop a 3 year plan for CSEPAC, which includes resending the survey in 2 years to coordinate with the CPR, then in 3 year cycles to monitor. Survey results can be used to get ideas for PAC actions.
- Provide support and information to families at PTO & BSA events.
- Plan an activity for families, like Co-host a Sensory Friendly Roller Skating night with local SEPACs.

Chelmsford Special Education Parent Advisory Council By Laws Approved 11/29/18

- Article I. Name: Chelmsford Special Education Parent Advisory Council, SEPAC, or CSEPAC
- **Article II. Mission Statement:** The mission is to effectively communicate the understanding, respect, and support for all children with special education needs in our community.

Article III. Purpose

- Section 1. Advise the school committee on matters that pertain to the education and safety of students with special needs. Participate in the planning, development and evaluation of the school district's special education programs.
- Section 2. Collaborate with the district to inform parents about their rights regarding special education.
- Section 3. Disseminate information about programs and services in the school system.
- Section 4. Help direct parents to advocacy, support services, and parent education opportunities.
- Section 5. Inform parents about special education legislation.

Article IV. Membership

- Section 1. General Membership shall be open to any resident of Chelmsford or person affiliated with the Chelmsford School System.
- Section 2. Voting Membership shall be open to parents/guardians of children with special needs who are receiving services through the Chelmsford School System. Members must have attended at least one previous business meeting during the current school year to vote in elections.

Article V. Officers and Liaisons

Section 1. The board members of this organization are the following but not limited to:

Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer

Section 2. Additional officer positions may be established and/or combined as needed. At least

two officers must be present to facilitate meetings. The term of office shall be one year from June to June. Officers must be re-elected at each annual meeting. Board members shall represent SEPAC as a non-partisan organization.

Section 3. Duties of the officers:

a. Chairperson

- i. Determine business meeting agenda and facilitate meetings.
- ii. Coordinate representation of SEPAC at public functions
- iii. The chairperson shall manage the activities of the organization.
- iv. Communicate with administration and the school committee regularly.
- v. Coordinate new board members receiving open meeting law materials.
- vi. Coordinate management of electronic communications, duty shared with secretary
- vii. Duties may be shared with a Co- Chairperson.

b. Secretary

- i. Shall be responsible for recording meeting minutes.
- ii. The secretary shall maintain a permanent file of the organization's by-laws, the meeting minutes, and records of Certificate of Receipt of Open Meeting Law material by board members.
- iii. The secretary shall maintain a record of all outside correspondence and post all meetings in accordance with open meeting laws.
- iv. Coordinate management of electronic communications, duty shared with Chairperson.

c. Treasurer

- i. Shall be responsible for maintaining the records for all monetary transactions of the organization
- ii. Manage purchase order requests and financial transactions made on behalf of SEPAC
- iii. Provide a report of monthly activity and funds balances at every general meeting
- iv. Provide a report of yearly activity and funds balances by June 30th
- v. Communicate with administration and/or school committee when needed.

Section 4. Duties of the liaisons:

- a. The liaisons of this organization assists the CSEPAC board by ensuring the most current information is accessible to special ed families within their school.
- b. Liaison responsibilities include: Act as liaison between his/her school and CSEPAC.
- c. Connect with school's PTO/BSA and share CSEPAC information.
- d. Communicate CSEPAC information to his/her school and school administration.

e. Attend CSEPAC meetings and provide status updates and feedback to CSEPAC Board.

Article VI. Election Procedures

Section 1. Officers shall be elected by a majority vote, of all in attendance, at the General Meeting

in May. 2.

Section 2. Nominations for office shall be discussed and accepted at the general business meeting prior to the May election. Absentee candidates can only be nominated with their written permission.

Section 3. If any office becomes vacant, an election for that office shall be held immediately, with person elected to complete the current term.

Article VII. Subcommittees and Interim Team

Section 1. Subcommittees

- a. shall be created as needed.
- b. The subcommittee chair shall be a volunteer or willing nominee accepted by a simple majority of the members present.
- c. The Subcommittee Chair is responsible for maintaining a record of subcommittee meetings to be presented at a business meeting.
- d. All subcommittee meetings are subject to Open Meeting Laws.

Section 2. Interim Team

- a. CSEPAC shall be established by the School Committee according to the provisions of The Massachusetts Spec Ed Law, ch. 71 B, Mass Gen Laws and exercising the powers and assuming the duties granted to it under said statute.
- b. In the event that the CSEPAC becomes inactive for a period of two or more years, an Interim Team consisting of three or more parents/guardians volunteers shall have the option to oversee the process of forming a SEPAC using the most current bylaws.
- c. Any parent volunteer that has a child with special needs in the district of Chelmsford is allowed the entitlement to equally participate in the forming of establishing or re-establishing the up and coming SEPAC.
- d. Interim team responsibilities are to oversee the formation of a parent elected board.

Article VIII. Meetings

Section 1. Business meetings shall be held at least quarterly, from September through June. When

- possible coordinate meeting calendar dates for the following school year by the end of the current school year.
- Section 2. Notices of all general meeting dates shall be posted at town hall and communicated to the public.
- Section 3. Annual elections will be held at the general meeting in May.

Article IX. Finances

Section 1. Public Funds: As a public body, SEPAC funds are subject to M.G.L. chapter 44, section

53A and chapter 71, section 37A. Funds raised by the PAC must be deposited with the municipal treasurer, held as a separate account, and become part of the district's End-of-Year Pupil and Financial Report.

Section 2. Private Funds: Private funds may not be collected in Chelmsford SEPAC's name.

Article X. Electronic Communications

- Section 1. Student confidentiality: The board shall take steps to ensure student confidentiality is maintained in all communications.
- Section 2. Electronic communications: All communications shall occur under the description of the applicable board member's position and/or additional duties as discussed at a SEPAC meeting. This includes, but is not limited to: email, text messaging, online messaging, social media, photo sharing, message boards.
- Section 3. Email: The board will have access to SEPAC email. Email shall not be used for personal communications of any kind, sharing any information about individual students or families, or deliberation or decision making about SEPAC business.
- **Article XI. Bylaws Amendments:** These bylaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote, of those in attendance, at a business meeting. By-Laws shall be reviewed at least every 3 years.

Re: Pending /Planned RFPs: Community Education Program – Westlands School

There are two (2) pending/planned Request for Proposals (RFP) being considered for improvements at the Westlands School funded by the Community Education Revolving Fund. Robyn Adams, Director of Community Education, provides a brief description of the two projects below:

Project #1 - Replace the old playground

The current playground was installed when the Westland's School housed elementary age children and has experienced significant deterioration. The playground was designed for children ages 5-12 years old. Westland's School is now home to Chelmsford Community Education and Chelmsford Integrated Preschool. The current population of students range in age from 18 months - 5 years old during the school year, and school-age during the summer months. Seventy five (75%) percent of the current playground structures are not age appropriate for our school year students.

We are designing a new playground that will be accessible to all three age groups. Each age group (toddlers, preschool and school age) will have a safe, separate space. There will also be a significant increase in the accessibility for students with mobility challenges. Some of the elements we are intending to include are inclusive equipment, a tricycle track, climbing and crawling elements and dramatic play structures. Our vision takes into consideration the unique needs of the student population.

Project #2 - Addition of air conditioning to the upstairs classrooms

Chelmsford Community Education hosts a multitude of programs during the summer months. For the summer of 2019 we will be offering the following programs:

> **Summerfest**: school age program with a capacity of 130 students per day.

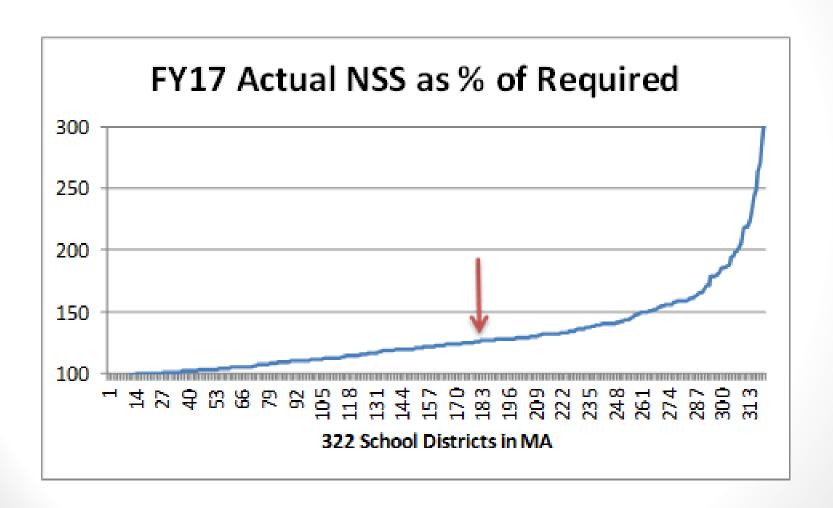

- All FY2020 salaries have been increased in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining and individual employment agreements. "Step" increases and "lane changes" have been incorporated into the FY2020 recommended budget figures. Anticipated teacher vacancies from announced retirements have been budgeted at \$56,967 (Step 3 on the master's degree salary schedule).
- Most collective bargaining agreements with union personnel expire on June 30, 2019. For budget planning purposes, each 1% cost-of-living-allowance (COLA) equates to \$440,000 in base salary expenses in the FY2020 budget. A 2% across-theboard COLA is included in the recommended budget, adding \$880,000 to base salary expenses in FY2020.

- The FY2020 budget reflects a decrease of \$ 719,000 in anticipated out-of-district special education tuition costs, offset by a decrease of \$50,000 in anticipated special education circuit-breaker reimbursement, as well as a decrease of \$ 75,000 in school choice funds offset, resulting in a net decrease of approximately \$600,000 in out-of-district special education tuition costs.
- The FY2020 budget reallocates 2.0 middle school teacher (7th grade) positions at McCarthy Middle School. During the 2017/18 school year 2.0 middle school teacher (5th grade) positions were reallocated from McCarthy Middle School. During the 2018/19 school year 2.0 middle school teacher (6th grade) positions were reallocated from McCarthy Middle School. We are continuing to reduce two sections (classes) each year at McCarthy Middle School making it possible to add other positions in the district while maintaining student:staff ratios in-line with district policy.

- The FY2020 budget adds an instructional classroom at the CHIPS Integrated Pre-School Program due to a projected increase in enrollment. Funding to provide a 1.0 Integrated Pre-School Teacher position and 2.0 paraprofessional positions has been incorporated into the recommended budget.
- The FY2020 budget includes an additional \$ 99,000 in contracted special education student transportation costs associated with the projected enrollment increase in the CHIPS Integrated Pre-School Program.

- The FY2020 budget adds a 1.0 Social Worker position at the Parker Middle School to provide a more appropriate student:staff counseling ratio. Parker currently employs 2.0 school counselor positions, while McCarthy Middle School employs 3.0 school counselor positions. This action brings the Parker student:staff counseling ratio from 351:1 to 236:1 in support of Goals I and II of the district's strategic plan.
- The FY2020 budget adds a .5 Special Education Teacher position at the Parker Middle School to provide required services in accordance with students' Individual Education Plans (IEP).

• The FY2020 budget adds 2.0 Elementary School Assistant Principal positions in support of Goals I and II of the district's strategic plan. During the 2018/19 school year a .5 FTE assistant principal position was added at the Byam, Center, Harrington and South Row Elementary Schools. During the 2019/20 school year an additional .5 FTE assistant principal position will be added at the Byam, Center, Harrington and South Row Elementary Schools providing a full-time assistant principal at each of our elementary schools.

The FY2020 budget reinstates a 1.0 Curriculum Coordinator –
World Language & Exchange Programs position previously
eliminated during the 2017/18 school year. In addition to
administering the district's world language program, this
reinstated position will be charged with the development and
support of a student exchange program at the middle and high
school levels of the district. This action is in support of Goal I
of the district's strategic plan.

The FY2020 budget adds a 1.0 Special Education
 Administrative Chairperson position in support of Goals I and
 II of the district's strategic plan. This action will improve
 special education chair:student ratios with the intent to better
 communication, responsiveness to parent and teacher
 inquires, and provide additional support of the district's
 intensive special education programming.

• Funding for a 1:1 computer initiative in the 2019/20 school year has been incorporated to provide all incoming 5th grade students at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools and 9th grade students at Chelmsford High School with a district-issued computer (Chromebook) for use at home and school. Additional computer technician staffing is included in the technology department to support this new 1:1 computer initiative.

- Funding to support "student service" and/or "student recognition" activities and clubs has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. This action eliminates student activity fees for clubs at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools and Chelmsford High School designated as "service" and/or "recognition" activities and clubs. A list of the proposed FY2020 (2019 /20 school year) "fee free" clubs may be referenced in Appendix B.
- Funding to support a reduction in student activity and club fees has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. A reduction from \$ 125/year to \$ 100/year is proposed at Chelmsford High School and a reduction from \$ 100/year to \$ 75/year is proposed at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools.

 Funding to support the elimination of student parking fees at Chelmsford High School has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. The current student parking fee of \$ 200/year is proposed to be eliminated (\$ 0/year) in FY2020 (2019/20 school year).

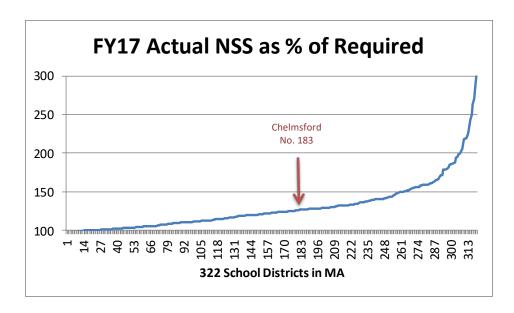

Chelmsford Public Schools General Fund Operating Budget Overview

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) tracks budgeted and actual spending in districts from year to year. DESE's most recently published actual figures are for FY2017, which ended June 30, 2017. From the reported and audited actual figures for each district, DESE determines each district's compliance with its net school spending obligation in dollars and in percentage of required spending. DESE annually publishes required net school spending and actual net school spending for each district in Massachusetts. In FY2017, 9 districts spent less than their required net school spending as computed by DESE; 313 districts exceeded their required net school spending. Chelmsford exceeded its required net school spending by 33% in FY2017, which is above the state median value of 23.2%. Across the state, 182 communities spent less than Chelmsford, whereas 139 communities spent more than Chelmsford as a percentage of total spending in excess of required net school spending, as illustrated in the graph below.



What Is Net School Spending?

The Massachusetts school finance statute, Chapter 70 of the General Laws, establishes an annual net school spending requirement for each school district. Net school spending includes each town school department's general fund expenditures (operating budget) as well as the town's direct spending for schools, but it excludes capital expenditures, transportation, grants,

and revolving funds. Required net school spending is the annual *minimum* that must be spent on schools, including carryover from previous years. As stated previously, Chelmsford exceeded its required net school spending requirement by 33% in FY2017 and in FY2018 is budgeted to exceed its required net school spending requirement by 38.8%.

To determine net school spending for the upcoming school year, the state uses school department enrollment data as of October 1 of the current school year (i.e., the October 1, 2018 student headcount is the basis for determining the FY2020 foundation budget and net school spending requirement). This is called foundation enrollment and is used to calculate the district's foundation budget. The foundation budget is the state's estimate of the *minimum* funding level needed in each district to provide an adequate educational program.

Massachusetts uses a complex formula that considers many factors, including each district's grade-level configuration, programs, and demographics. The formula also considers each community's relative wealth and determines each community's "required local contribution" toward the educational program.

Comparable Community Analysis: Demographic Data

Although it is important to compare Chelmsford to the state average with regard to spending and academic performance, it is also necessary to assess Chelmsford's spending and academic performance with its most comparable peer communities across the state. Table I provides general demographic data for Chelmsford and its ten most comparable districts as determined by DESE.

With regard to the number of economically disadvantaged students enrolled, Chelmsford falls in the top third of its most comparable districts. Seven districts have a lower percentage of students and three districts have a higher percentage of students designated economically disadvantaged. Some 12.9% of all Chelmsford Public School students are identified as economically disadvantaged. This is an increase from last year (2016-17), when 11.2% of all students were identified as economically disadvantaged and in 2014-15 when 8.2% of all Chelmsford Public School students were identified as economically disadvantaged.

With respect to the number of students identified with disabilities (SWD), Chelmsford falls in the top third of its most comparable districts. Of all Chelmsford Public School students, 16.6% have disabilities and require special education services, as outlined in their Individual Education Plan (IEP). Seven districts have a lower percentage of students and three districts have a higher percentage of students identified with disabilities.

The percentage of students classified as English language learners (ELL) in the Chelmsford Public Schools is higher than nine of its ten most comparable communities. Only one comparable community, Melrose, has a higher percentage of ELL students.

Comparable Community Analysis: Financial Support

Within the last few years, DESE has tried to make district and school demographic and performance data more accessible to district staff and the general public. The District Analysis and Review Tools (DARTs) provided by DESE allow users to track and analyze data over time to make comparisons to state and comparable districts. The DARTs select the ten most comparable school districts in the state based on student enrollment characteristics, special populations, and grade-span groupings (i.e., K–12, elementary, secondary). Grade-span groupings are an important point of comparison because districts are often compared with their neighbors based solely on geography. However, a district's comparison to similar districts across the state is often more valuable when balancing programs and services against level of spending and student achievement.

Table II highlights actual net school spending in FY2017 as a percentage of required net school spending for the ten most comparable districts to Chelmsford, as determined by DESE.

Table II shows that seven comparable districts—Billerica, Walpole, Easton, North Andover, Marshfield, North Attleborough and Melrose—spent less than Chelmsford in FY2017 as a percentage in excess of the district's required net school spending. Three comparable districts—Milton, Natick and Wakefield—spent more than Chelmsford in FY2017 as a percentage in excess of the district's required net school spending. In addition to the ten comparable districts as determined by DESE, the FY2017 state median spending in excess of required net school spending is listed at 123.2%.

DARTs also analyze other aspects of comparable districts, including staff-to-student ratios. DESE reports the most recent staff-to-student data for FY2017, which ended June 30, 2017. Table III presents the overall student-teacher ratio in Chelmsford, its ten most comparable districts as determined by DESE, and the state average.

Table III shows that among its most comparable districts in the state, Chelmsford's student-teacher ratio is better than eight of its peer communities (Walpole, Natick, Wakefield, Easton, Milton, Melrose, North Attleborough and North Andover). However, two of its peer communities (Billerica and Marshfield) have a better student-teacher ratio than Chelmsford. The average student-teacher ratio among all Massachusetts school districts is also lower than Chelmsford's. Even though Chelmsford has had an enrollment decline of 661 students in its foundation enrollment between FY2008 and FY2018, its current student-teacher ratio is still higher than the state average.

The student-teacher ratio is helpful for gauging a district's overall standing with regard to its comparable communities, but it does not give a true picture of the district's student-teacher ratio. This calculation takes all students reported on the October 1 headcount and divides them by the number of teachers in the district. The ratio does not consider special programs with lower-than-average class size (e.g., self-contained special education programs). At the regular meeting of the Chelmsford School Committee on December 18, 2018, grade-by-grade breakdowns of student enrollment at each elementary and middle school in the district were reported. These figures are more useful for budgeting purposes because they depict actual homeroom class size. The October 1, 2018 student enrollment report is included as Appendix A.

Another measure commonly referred to when reviewing spending among school districts is average teacher salaries. Table IV lists the data for each comparable district and the state.

These data show that Chelmsford's average teacher salary is higher than six of its peer communities (North Attleborough, Wakefield, Walpole, Natick, Marshfield and Melrose) and lower than four peer communities (Milton, Billerica, North Andover and Easton). The average teacher salary for all school districts in the state is higher than Chelmsford's average.

Another measure often used to compare districts is the amount of money spent to educate each student in the district, often referred to as the per-pupil expenditure. This cumulative figure includes all district expenditures on administration; instructional leadership; teachers; teaching services; professional development; instructional materials and equipment (including technology); guidance, counseling, and testing services; pupil services; operations and maintenance; and employee benefits. Table V presents the FY2017 per-pupil expenditure for each of Chelmsford's comparable districts.

DESE provides the per-pupil expenditures for in-district students. As Table V shows, five of our comparable districts (Billerica, Natick, Walpole, Wakefield and Milton) spent more overall per pupil than Chelmsford, and five comparable districts (Easton, Marshfield, Melrose, North Andover and North Attleborough) spent less. The median per-pupil expenditure for all districts in the state is \$2,124 higher than Chelmsford.

Conclusion

The Chelmsford Public School District provides an exceptional education to the students entrusted to our care. The district effectively uses the resources appropriated annually by Town Meeting to serve the needs of an ever-diversifying student population. Although Chelmsford exceeds minimum net school spending on public education, and spends slightly more than the state average of district spending above net school spending, Chelmsford spends \$ 2,124 less per-pupil than the state median per-pupil expenditure statewide. In Chelmsford, average teacher salaries are lower and student-teacher ratios are higher than the state average, but they are in the mid-range of comparable districts. Per-pupil spending is lower than the state average but in the mid-range of per-pupil spending in comparable districts.

Additional funding would enhance the educational experience of Chelmsford students, however the programs and services currently provided yield exceptional results, as demonstrated by standardized testing measures. Overall, our students' academic achievement makes it clear that the town of Chelmsford is receiving a positive return on its investment in public education. Chelmsford's students are also involved in athletics, community service, and fine and performing arts, thereby fulfilling the roles of productive and valued members of the community.

FY2020 Budget Overview

Several budget assumptions underlie the FY2020 budget. The town manager has included a \$ 2 million increase in funding for the Chelmsford Public Schools, an increase from \$ 59 million to \$ 61 million in the Town of Chelmsford FY2020 general operating budget. Following is a list of the assumptions that have been incorporated into the FY2020 superintendent's recommended budget.

- All FY2020 salaries have been increased in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining and individual employment agreements. "Step" increases and "lane changes" have been incorporated into the FY2020 recommended budget figures. Anticipated teacher vacancies from announced retirements have been budgeted at \$56,967 (Step 3 on the master's degree salary schedule).
- Most collective bargaining agreements with union personnel expire on June 30, 2019. For budget planning purposes, each 1% cost-of-living-allowance (COLA) equates to \$440,000 in base salary expenses in the FY2020 budget. A 2% across-the-board COLA is included in the recommended budget, adding \$880,000 to base salary expenses in FY2020.
- The FY2020 budget reflects a decrease of \$ 719,000 in anticipated out-of-district special education tuition costs, offset by a decrease of \$50,000 in anticipated special education circuit-breaker reimbursement, as well as a decrease of \$ 75,000 in school choice funds offset, resulting in a net decrease of approximately \$600,000 in out-of-district special education tuition costs.
- The FY2020 budget reallocates 2.0 middle school teacher (7th grade) positions at McCarthy Middle School. During the 2017/18 school year 2.0 middle school teacher (5th

grade) positions were reallocated from McCarthy Middle School. During the 2018/19 school year 2.0 middle school teacher (6th grade) positions were reallocated from McCarthy Middle School. We are continuing to reduce two sections (classes) each year at McCarthy Middle School making it possible to add other positions in the district while maintaining student:staff ratios in-line with district policy.

- The FY2020 budget adds an instructional classroom at the CHIPS Integrated Pre-School Program due to a projected increase in enrollment. Funding to provide a 1.0 Integrated Pre-School Teacher position and 2.0 paraprofessional positions has been incorporated into the recommended budget.
- The FY2020 budget includes an additional \$ 99,000 in contracted special education student transportation costs associated with the projected enrollment increase in the CHIPS Integrated Pre-School Program.
- The FY2020 budget adds a 1.0 Social Worker position at the Parker Middle School to provide a more appropriate student:staff counseling ratio. Parker currently employs 2.0 school counselor positions, while McCarthy Middle School employs 3.0 school counselor positions. This action brings the Parker student:staff counseling ratio from 351:1 to 236:1 in support of Goals I and II of the district's strategic plan.
- The FY2020 budget adds a .5 Special Education Teacher position at the Parker Middle School to provide required services in accordance with students' Individual Education Plans (IEP).
- The FY2020 budget adds 2.0 Elementary School Assistant Principal positions in support of Goals I and II of the district's strategic plan. During the 2018/19 school year a .5 FTE assistant principal position was added at the Byam, Center, Harrington and South Row Elementary Schools. During the 2019/20 school year an additional .5 FTE assistant principal position will be added at the Byam, Center, Harrington and South Row Elementary Schools providing a full-time assistant principal at each of our elementary schools.
- The FY2020 budget reinstates a 1.0 Curriculum Coordinator World Language & Exchange Programs position previously eliminated during the 2017/18 school year. In addition to administering the district's world language program, this reinstated position will be charged with the development and support of a student exchange program at

the middle and high school levels of the district. This action is in support of Goal I of the district's strategic plan.

- The FY2020 budget adds a 1.0 Special Education Administrative Chairperson position in support of Goals I and II of the district's strategic plan. This action will improve special education chair:student ratios with the intent to better communication, responsiveness to parent and teacher inquires, and provide additional support of the district's intensive special education programming.
- Beyond the additional staffing in support of Goal I and Goal II of the district's strategic plan as outlined above, the FY2020 budget further supports families and students in a few significant ways:
 - Funding for a 1:1 computer initiative in the 2019/20 school year has been incorporated to provide all incoming 5th grade students at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools and 9th grade students at Chelmsford High School with a district-issued computer (Chromebook) for use at home and school. Additional computer technician staffing is included in the technology department to support this new 1:1 computer initiative.
 - o Funding to support "student service" and/or "student recognition" activities and clubs has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. This action eliminates student activity fees for clubs at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools and Chelmsford High School designated as "service" and/or "recognition" activities and clubs. A list of the proposed FY2020 (2019 /20 school year) "fee free" clubs may be referenced in Appendix B.
 - Funding to support a reduction in student activity and club fees has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. A reduction from \$ 125/year to \$ 100/year is proposed at Chelmsford High School and a reduction from \$ 100/year to \$ 75/year is proposed at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools.
 - Funding to support the elimination of student parking fees at Chelmsford High School has been incorporated in the FY2020 budget. The current student parking fee of \$ 200/year is proposed to be eliminated (\$ 0/year) in FY2020 (2019/20 school year).

The FY2020 superintendent's recommended budget continues to include Circuit Breaker, School Choice, and the Valley Collaborative reimbursement as revenue offsets in support of the Chelmsford Public Schools.

The superintendent's recommended FY2020 budget was crafted in support of the district's strategic plan, specifically the academic and social emotional goals and initiatives that have been and will continue to be the focus of our collective work in the years to come.

On January 28, 2019, Town Manager Cohen released his recommended FY2020 budget for the Town of Chelmsford. Included in his recommended budget is a \$2 million increase, \$59 million to \$61 million, to support the Chelmsford Public Schools. I will be working closely with the schools on enrollment projections, especially the middle schools and high school, as they complete their course registration and selection process for 2019/20. I look forward to working with the school committee to review and present to town meeting an FY2020 local operating budget for the Chelmsford Public Schools that not only maintains the integrity of the programs and services we offer, but continues to align our available resources to meet the identified district goals and objectives for the 2019/20 school year.

During the past several school years, the District tuitioned fifty (50) students from neighboring communities into the Chelmsford Public Schools. The District receives \$ 5,000 per student enrolled through the Commonwealth's School Choice Program. The anticipated School Choice receipts are being utilized as a revenue offset to support the CPS local operating budget. \$ 75,000 is offset to the 1:1 computer initiative and \$ 175,000 is offset to the out-of-district tuition expenses.

The District anticipates receiving a credit from Valley Collaborative in FY2020, as Valley is projecting revenue in excess of the amount they are able to retain at fiscal yearend. The amount above the allowable retainable limit must either be returned or credited to Valley's partner districts in proportion to the amount paid over the fiscal year. Chelmsford anticipates a credit of approximately \$ 200,000 in FY2020. I recommend a portion be used to offset the FY2020 local operating budget as it directly relates to special education tuition. I am recommending \$ 167,347 be used to bring the FY2020 local operating budget into balance and meet the Town Manager's recommended \$ 61 million budget for the Chelmsford Public Schools in FY2020.

We supplied the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) with our October 1, 2018 student enrollment data which has been certified by DESE. This enrollment information is the basis for the FY20 Chapter 70 state aid calculation. Based on the certified data supplied to DESE, I have prepared the attached spreadsheet displaying the overall district enrollment by grade level in the top section of the report and then further breakdown the enrollment by grade and school below in the sections that follow. For each of the elementary and middle schools I have incorporated the number of mainstream homerooms into the spreadsheet to produce an average class size for grades 1 through 8. I am working with Chelmsford High School to review the individual class rosters to produce a similar class size report for review with the upcoming FY20 budget deliberations. Highlights of the report are as follows:

Elementary School Level Highlights

Average class size for our full day Kindergarten classrooms range between a low of 22 students per classroom at Byam to a high of 26 students per classroom at Center. At the 1st grade level, classrooms range between 20 and 26 students. At the second grade level, classrooms range between 20 and 25 students. At the 3rd and 4th grade levels, average class sizes are lowest and range between 20 and 22 students in our four elementary schools.

Middle School Level Highlights

Overall class size at the middle school grade levels is exceptionally good, averaging 19 to 25 students in grades 6 through 8 at both McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools.

This student enrollment data is important as we begin establishing desirable conditions and budget parameters for the FY20 budget development process in the new year.
