## **Novice Level:**

A novice language learner can use small, repetitive, and memorized phrases on familiar topics. They can identify some cultural practices and products, as well as give opinions.

#### **Intermediate Level:**

An intermediate language learner can use strings of simple sentences, begin to ask original questions and has a wider variety of vocabulary on a range of topics. They can use connector words to put different ideas together and make connections among products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture.

## **Intermediate Mid-/Advanced Low Level:**

A high intermediate or advanced low language learner can use strings of sentences to explain their ideas, ask original questions, and speak at length on a variety of familiar and unfamiliar topics. They can use different tenses in speaking and writing and make connections among products, practices, and perspectives of the target culture.
