



Taking a Dual Enrollment Course?

Registration Instructions

It's time to register for Spring Semester Dual Enrollment courses!

What is dual enrollment?: A program for college ready high school students who want to earn college credit while working towards high school graduation requirements.

How to register:

1. Ask your teacher for a registration form. Be sure to get the correct CRN, course name and title from your teacher.
2. **You must see your Guidance Counselor with your completed application/registration form to by January 30th, 2022.**
3. Please request a copy of your CHS transcript from your Guidance Counselor and attach it to your completed application/registration form.
4. Submit completed forms (with signatures and transcript) to Ms. Quinn in Emerson House no later than February 5th, 2022. Forms will be reviewed before delivery to MCC.


Payments:

1. Sometime in February/March you should receive a bill directly from Middlesex Community College.
2. Review your bill carefully. Each course costs \$92 per credit. If you are taking a 3 credit course your bill should total \$276. Some of our science and business courses are 4 credit classes. If you are enrolled in a 4 credit course your total should be \$368.
3. If you receive a bill for the incorrect amount or if you see additional charges on your bill please contact the Student Accounts department at Middlesex Community College directly.

Benefits:

- You will earn your college credit at a significantly reduced cost (\$92 per credit).
- Through the [Mass Transfer](https://www.mass.edu/masstransfer/about/home.asp) program, dual enrollment credits will transfer to all Massachusetts State Colleges and Universities. Many private institutions and out-of-state institutions also accept the credit. Other Ways to Transfer

If you are not following one of the MassTransfer Pathways, there are still transfer options available that let you take advantage of the course and program maps that have been created—search for course equivalencies between our community colleges, state universities and University of Massachusetts campuses.

Many community colleges have additional transfer agreements and campus equivalency guides with public and private colleges and universities that do not fall under the MassTransfer statewide policy.

If you're looking to transfer from a Massachusetts community college to a four-year independent college, you may be able to take advantage of the Massachusetts Independent College Transfer Guarantee (MA-Guarantee).
