What is Heritage Spanish?

This World Language course is for students who are native speakers of Spanish and/or students who identify as Hispanic/Latino/x. It will be taught by a native speaker and focus on cultural studies in the Spanish-speaking world, literature, history, and identity. Native speakers have different needs than students who are learning Spanish as a second language and the goal of this course is to encourage them to learn about their own cultures and identity, as well as to improve their literacy skills in Spanish.

Will Heritage Spanish count for 2 years of World Language credit?

Yes! We will offer two sections: one for freshman/sophomores, and one for juniors/seniors. There will be a CP and an Honors option. If students begin their freshman year, they will be in a two-year cohort of that class. In other words, the curriculum will rotate every two years.
