#### **Chair Opening Statement**

#### **Consent Agenda**

Mr. Moses motioned to approve the regular committee meeting minutes of January 18, 2022. Mr. Doherty seconded. Motion carries 5-0.

#### **CHS Student Representative Announcements**

Katrina shared that term 3 is starting and February Break will be coming up soon. On January 27<sup>th</sup> a meeting was held for the parents of eighth grade students. The event was successful and concluded with tours of CHS. A group called "College Bound" will zoom with parents with information on how to save money for college on February 7<sup>th</sup>. The annual "In Tune" concert will be held on February 11<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.

Sarah added that The Crescendos and The Thursdays will competing this weekend. They have won many awards through the years and, hopefully, will do so again. Yesterday saw the "Mock Trial Competition". CHS defeated Arlington. A team of students led by Michael Kelliher, Jennie Huynh, Mahijith Chava and Larry Yang recently received a "shout out" from Chelmsford Telemedia TV on the new "CHS Door Painting Project". The paintings on the doors are chosen to reflect the personality of the teacher for each room.

#### **Good News**

Dr. Hirsch shared that there has been great interest expressed in upcoming student trips. In 2023 a trip is planned for The Galapagos Islands and registration for that event is already full! There are still openings for the Spanish and French exchange student programs. Details for these are on the World Languages website. Middle school students were able to enjoy snowshoeing thanks to last weekend's snow storm. CHS performance classes are getting ready for the trip to Disney later this month. McCarthy will present *Moana Junior* on February 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. In a partnership with The Chelmsford Water Department, "The Pathway" for science is being developed for life sciences.

Mr. Doherty added that he virtually attended the recent mock trial and the students were wonderful! Our student rep, Sarah, did a phenomenal job "under heavy grilling and cross examination"!

#### **New Business**

#### 1. Spotlight on the Schools: South Row Elementary School

South Row School's Principal, Ms. Terri Gilbert, and Assistant Principal, Mr. Jason Ramalho, joined the meeting tonight to update The Committee on happenings at South Row. Their presentation focuses on partnering done with students, staff, families and community. To help welcome students and families back to the school-4th grade "play dates" were held during the summer. This also provided Ms. Gilbert with an opportunity to meet people since she is new to the South Row community. Kindergarten orientation and K-4 tours of the school also took place. Videos were shared for "moving up" to the next grade. The PTO supported all the events. SEL is important and students are rewarded for realizing positive expectations by receiving PRIDE tickets and PRIDE stickers and "shout outs" during morning announcements. A photo is taken of the student with his/her PRIDE sticker and is shared with the family. "Happy notes" are also being sent home for students. In January the whole school participated in a door decorating challenge, based on the themes of respect, responsibility, safety and kindness! Included in South Row's slide show are students form Ms. Stagnone's class talking about the door decorating experience. Additionally, fourth graders are involved in Student Council and all are encouraged to apply. These students are seen as student leaders, contribute to ideas for the school and assist in school jobs and tasks (safety patrol. kindergarten helpers, and classroom readers). The slides included students sharing about the Students Council Leadership Program. Visits from therapy dogs are very popular with students and families alike. The PTO, with the assistance of CHS students, painted games on the blacktop in the recess area. "Officer High Five Friday" brings monthly visits to the school from police officers, and members of other town departments in the future. Monthly "Walk to School Day" events are also popular. The focus is on safe walking routes and overall wellness. Recently the School Council" held a "Parent Discussion Night" which focused on wellness. It was virtually attended by over 35 participants. Academic initiatives have included DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) and include PD, podcasts, teacher/staff collaboration and student grade level meetings. Fun reading and math challenges are included for students to work on at home with their families. In October alone students read for over 57,000 minutes with their families! In January almost 10,000 minutes of math facts were highlighted!

Mr. Ramalho closed the presentation by sharing additional happenings which make South Row such a special school. Each month the school focuses on doing a kindly act that benefits others and also supports the "Wish Project Partnership". The school also has a monthly "Spirit Day" to help build community. The PTO and other committees foster events through the school year like the science fair, pumpkin fair, gardening and an international festival. To fully appreciate South Row School the entire presentation may be viewed on Chelmsford Telemedia You/Tube.

#### 2. Dore & Whittier Architects: Districtwide Facilities Master Plan Options Discussion

Brad and Michelle came to tonight's meeting to follow up on the detailed presentation given two meetings ago about the master building plan. Dr. Lang is hopeful that The Committee will be able to decide after tonight's comparison between McCarthy and Parker is shared. The slide show for tonight is included in the agenda packet, but to fully appreciate all of the details involved, watching the Chelmsford Telemedia You/Tube is advised. The cost of repairs/maintenance over the next ten years will cost close to \$7 million dollars for Parker. ADA compliance for Parker would be much costlier to implement to bring the building up to code. Without modular classrooms McCarthy has space to serve 800 students, Parker's capacity is only 572. Movement of students through Parker is more difficult than McCarthy. To bring Parker up to current code three additional elevators would need to be installed. Movement through the McCarthy building is very direct and simple. Restrooms are convenient at McCarthy, unlike Parker. To bring ADA up to code at McCarthy would be less costly than at Parker. McCarthy's auditorium (Parker only has a stage area in the cafeteria) was recently renovated. During that time ADA issues were addressed. Dore & Whittier believes the district should move forward with submitting Parker for the MSBA process. The Committee agrees on submitting Parker. Dr. Lang will be asking for a formal vote when the Statement of Interest application is being fleshed out.

#### 3. Superintendent's Recommended FY2023 Budget

Dr. Lang presented the proposed FY2023 budget. The details are not contained in tonight's agenda packet but will be posted on the website tomorrow for public view. Dr. Lang shared slides of the budget tonight during his presentation of highlights to The Committee. After tonight The Committee will have a month to review the budget, share input and ask questions before the meeting on March 1, 2022, when the budget hearing will be held. The Committee members were given a budget packet tonight and Dr. Lang will share it with the town reps. The budget format is the same as the past few years. It begins with a narrative and moves into the system-wide budget. The summary is found on page 10. On March 1st, the meeting will start on page 11 and each category level detail will be presented for questions or comments. The budget totals \$67.5 million dollars, which is an increase of \$2.5 million over last year. The increase amount was recommended by Town Manager Cohen. The staff salaries are listed in the personnel section of the budget. The appendices at the end of the packet include: student enrollment data and projection; data for clubs and activities; a grant level summary and revolving accounts and other summary documents. The FY2022 budget in in great shape. To fully appreciate Dr. Lang's presentation, you should view it on Chelmsford Telemedia You/Tube. Dr. Lang also highlighted several additional items for the budget to be discussed further on March 1, 2022. Building administrators and special ed staff will attend that meeting to elaborate on a program or service to be considered for the budget. Some of these include: a middle school language-based program to be begun in grade five; for CHS two additional special ed teachers (one for the PAVE program, the other for the STEP program); for the middle schools an increase of 1.5 FT psychologists to help meet the increasing needs of the middle school population (COVID has increased the needs); for three social worker/family counselors for each education level to meet increasing mental health and counseling needs; a pay increase for substitutes (teachers, nurses and paras); and funding for the final 1:1 Technology Initiative which will be in its fourth year. Committee members should contact Dr. Lang with questions on any of these.

#### 4. Update to CPS COVID-19 Mitigation Strategy: At-Home Rapid Antigen Testing

Dr. Lang shared that of the over 4600 COVID tests administered this past year, only 37 tested positive. The district has been doing very well keeping track of the virus. Adopting "Pool Testing" and "Test and Stay" worked well. Recently the case numbers are falling (after a spike after the holidays). DESE has made "at home" test kits available for staff. Now they are promoting a program where staff and students

are able to do a weekly test at home. Pool testing will be maintained to support this. The test kits will be sent home every other Friday starting this week. This program is voluntary but **positive tests must be reported to the school!** Any positive cases reported to the district will be tracked. Contact tracing and "test and stay" will be discontinued. Dr. Lang has sent a letter with all the details about the new mitigation procedures to all district families and the community.

#### **Liaison Reports**

Ms. Santos shared that the Steering Committee for the Strategic Plan met. The Chair said that Center School PTO met last week. They are working on providing three enrichment activities for each grade during this school year. They also gave classroom supplies to each teacher. They are doing a calendar raffle with local restaurants for their major fund raiser. They are excited that their new playground will be constructed this summer! CHIPS PTO will hold a virtual meeting on February 7<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Newman shared that The Chelmsford Friends of Music have money available for classroom teachers to purchase musical instruments like keyboards and ukuleles. They also have scholarships available for which information is available at The College and Career Center.

#### **New Items**

Next meeting is next Tuesday. The Select Board would like The Committee to attend a meeting with them between March 14th and 28<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Good News**

Dr. Hirsch shared that, despite the snow, McCarthy Middle School students were able to present the play *Moana Junior*. It was nicely done, and they had a good time. Nine students will be representing CHS this year for the Massachusetts Music Educators Association and their All State Festival. They will perform a concert at Boston's Symphony Hall in March.

Mr. Doherty thanked the local attorneys who volunteered their time to help with the CHS Mock Trial.

#### **New Business**

#### 1. Presentation: Social Emotional Learning and Student Mental Health Update

Presenting tonight are Ms. Shannon Bischoff, Coordinator of Social Emotional Learning & Counseling Services, and Ms. Katie Simes, Coordinator of Health & Physical Education. Ms. Simes shared that the

Youth Risk Behavior Survey was done this year for grades six through 12 to gather mental health data. Ms. Bischoff added that the Pandemic "exacerbated the growing crisis in youth mental health" and wellbeing. Addressing these needs for our students and our community is an ongoing collaboration between school and community resources. The district has incredibly dedicated counselors, psychologists, social workers, teaching staff and administrators, as well as interns from local colleges, who respond to the current needs. The slide show included in tonight's agenda packet provides information on this staffing for all education levels and Ms. Bischoff elaborated on their roles and the support they offer. Ms. Simes shared and spoke of the data gathered on the student survey. In summary, many risky behaviors were reduced significantly from the previous surveys (i.e. drinking alcohol, vaping, marijuana use, sexual intercourse). These changes were most likely an impact of COVID and the accompanying changes in daily life, with people of all ages spending more time at home! Sadly, some mental health concerns remained stagnant while others have shown slight increases. Student participation at CHS was only 80%, which was probably because the survey was given right after the December holiday break, when the absentee rate was higher than normal. The data shows that improvement can be made for more students to feel that they can speak about a problem with an adult staff member in school. Self-harm data also stagnated from the last survey, with about 15% of middle school students and 17% of high school students reporting self-injury. This number should also be decreasing. About 12% of middle school students reported considering suicide during the past 12 months with the majority of the students who reported this identified as "other" or "transgender/non-binary". About 14.4% of high school students reported seriously considering suicide, which is an increase from two years ago. These results indicate a more pro-active approach is needed from the mental health support staff. Questions about stress, anxiety and depression on a daily basis during the last 30 days, showed that 73% of middle school students were not experiencing these mental health issues.

Ms. Bischoff shared that this data informs the need for more support for students, by school staff and community resources. Addressing the mental health needs of the students will remove obstacles to learning and social-emotional well-being so each student can reach their potential. Many community resources have reached the maximum of their ability to provide services, which is currently placing more demand on the school resources. To help meet the increased need, more training is offered for the support staff. Recently local school districts began collaborating in clinician training, trauma-informed practices and services offered to groups of students. Partnering with families and care-givers at home is key to helping students. Sadly, in-patient services, which are over capacity, often need to resort to waiting lists. After school clubs and programs are offered at CHS and both middle schools. LGBTQ training was conducted this last week for staff. A database of SEL resources is being compiled state wide, which will help provide some teletherapy.

Ms. Bischoff shared positive updates on curriculum and programs at all levels to address Social Emotional Learning. MTSS facilitators are available at all levels as well and Tier 1 and Tier 2 teams meet regularly to review data and plan accordingly. The Second Step SEL program is now being used at the middle schools (after several years of success at elementary). Counselors and health teachers are collaborating on programs to address suicide prevention and mental health awareness curriculum. A new SEL curriculum at CHS called "Character Strong" has been added this school year and is taught by classroom teachers. Many additional initiatives are under way to lead students to seek mental health resources and provide more peer-to-peer support at the high school. It is important during these stressful times that the adults help students to recognize their strengths and resiliency and inspire "hope"!

Ms. Simes added that there is a district-wide MTSS team, including one or more representatives from each school as well as administrators from Central Office. Data is reviewed on all programs to address changes and future needs. In addition to students, the needs of school staff are being addressed. Both Ms. Bischoff and Ms. Simes offered answers to questions asked by The Committee.

Tonight's presentation was packed full of information and to fully appreciate it you should watch the presentation on Chelmsford Telemedia You/Tube. Please know that the challenges face by CPS at this time are not unique and are mirrored by the other districts in Massachusetts. The final slide (before the bibliography) was filled with details on the plans going forward to respond to SEL needs and a verbal thank you to all staff for supporting student needs. The Committee expressed deep gratitude for all that is being done for our students.

## 2. Questions/requests for additional information on Superintendent's Recommended FY2023 Budget

The Chair asked if any Committee member had any questions on the budget they would like to ask tonight instead of waiting for the budget hearing at the next regular meeting. Ms. Santos is concerned about the size of classes. She would like assurance that the recommended class size of 25 will remain in place. She is troubled by some classes which have as many as 27 students enrolled. Dr. Lang responded that the policy states that class sizes should "average" 25. Sometimes it is acceptable to have more than 25 if the class is an honors class for example. That is better than telling some students that the class is full, and they will have to choose another course he explained. He is meeting with middle school administrators to address class sizes there moving forward. A working group will be created to study this for the 2023/24 school year to examine all possible options. Ms. Newcomb asked if classes with students on IEPs have low enough enrollment, so all student needs are being met? Dr. Lang responded that often classes with students of special needs are co-taught by the addition of a special ed teacher working with the classroom teacher. Paraprofessionals are also added to support the teachers as needed. On March 1st during the budget hearing, the public will be able to ask questions as the review goes page by page. Questions may also be submitted by email for people who are unable to attend that night.

### 3. Update on COVID-19 Pool Testing, At-Home Rapid Antigen Testing, and Student Vaccination Status

Dr. Lang's update tonight is accompanied by slides which are included in tonight's agenda packet. Information shared includes the numbers of students (who reside in Chelmsford) in each age group who are fully vaccinated. He also shared data on vaccination status of students enrolled in each of the Chelmsford Public Schools. Pool testing continues and produces good numbers with a positivity rate of 0.5% most weeks. He included "Test and Stay" figures through January, but the program will be ending. The new "Rapid Antigen Testing" has begun and will be done at home with test kits provided every Friday. One test will be conducted each week. The weekly dashboard information posted on Fridays will be ongoing. DESE's mask mandate is scheduled to end on February 28, 2022. Current district policy requires masks **inside** all school buildings.

#### 4. Spring 2022 MCAS Schedule

Dr. Hirsch included a memorandum in tonight's packet which provides information and dates for MCAS testing this spring. There will be a return to the two MCAS sessions for all students, which was the norm before COVID. The class of 2022 will not need to take MCAS for a competency determination. Their high school course work will support the competency determination through The State. This waiver will also apply to the class of 2023 for science **only**. Students in the top 10% of their class who have exceeded the standards will be eligible for The Abigail Adams Scholarship tuition voucher at Massachusetts State Colleges. Those students took the MCAS this fall to qualify. EL students in the class of 2022 and 2023 will receive an ELA waiver if they pass their English classes with rigor. They may then take their native language tests to receive The Seal of Biliteracy Consideration. 18 CHS students have received this Seal in the past two years. Our English Language Learners take the Access test each January and February.

#### **Liaison Reports**

Ms. Santos shared that Harrington PTO met on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Parents who attend these meetings are recognized by the school principal. They will be having a math challenge in March, along with many other activities including the Book Fair. Ms. Newcomb stated that South Row still meets remotely but is anticipating in-person meetings soon. They will be holding a virtual science fair, their book fair, and will collect gently used children's books to donate to a community organization. Mr. Doherty reported that the Boosters Club met and many of the coaches and hockey captains attended who thanked Boosters for providing a skate sharpening machine! The Girls Sprint Medley Relay will participate in the national tournament in Manhattan with financial help from The Boosters. Boosters' St. Patrick's event tickets may be purchased on their website. The Chair added that CHIPS had their most successful basket raffle to date! Enrichment activities will continue monthly and staff appreciation events are scheduled.

#### **Chair Opening Statement**

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#### **Public Comments**

Linda Moran, of 112 Westford Street, spoke of her concern for students wearing masks in the CPS. She expressed many instances where she felt mask wearing was especially having an impact on the mental health, social well-being and learning for CHS students. She shared her belief that masks are harmful and offer "no benefits". She would like the face covering policy to be rescinded.

Katie Sullivan, of the Chelmsford Federation of teachers spoke next. She asked that the School Committee in deciding about continuing the policy of mask wearing in school, consider that fact that many staff live with immunocompromised family at home. These teachers would want to be able to have their students wear masks in their classrooms. Those staff would appreciate the support of The Committee to protect these persons when deciding on the face coverings policy.

Melissa McDonald, of Six Colonial Terrace, who has four children in CPS and is a teacher at a neighboring district. Despite being vaccinated several of her family have had COVID19. She is concerned that continuing masking will harm the children. She is worried about the health and behavior issues of the students. She would like The Committee to move to remove the face covering policy.

The Chair stated that others have contacted The School Committee this week asking that the mask policy be rescinded.

#### **New Business**

#### 1. Review and Consideration of School Committee Policy EBCFA - Face Coverings

Dr. Hirsch provided slides and a verbal update as of today. Face coverings were approved on 8/18/2020. On February 9, 2022 Governor Baker and Commissioner Riley announced that the mandate would be lifted on 2/28/2022. She summarized the details of the Face Coverings policy, including information on exemptions and social distancing. She shared the vaccination rates for each school. Consultation has been ongoing with The Chelmsford Health Department, Massachusetts Department of Public Health and testing for COVID is being made available for all CPS students through "Pool Testing" and at-home rapid antigen testing. The positivity rate is declining. Vaccine clinics are still being held. The Chelmsford Health Department has recommended a delay in rescinding the mask mandate until March 14, 2022, due to the vacation week in February. Data proves there are positivity upticks in the virus after school breaks have taken place. The Massachusetts DPH advises masks still to be worn indoors for any who are elderly, have weakened immune systems or underlying medical conditions. Unvaccinated individuals should continue to wear masks to prevent further spread of COVID 19.

If the mask mandate were to be rescinded face coverings will **continue to be required** on school busses (per federal government mandate) and in health care offices in school. Continued monitoring will be shared with updates on the COVID 19 Dashboard. Information will be shared on availability of vaccine and booster clinics. The Committee may decide tonight to keep or rescind Policy EBCFA. They may amend the policy, or they may adopt the (MASC) Massachusetts Association of School Committees' proposed policy which includes guidance from the CDC, DESE, and the Mass. Dept. of Public Health. Dr. Hirsch has included a slide with the details and also reviewed it during tonight's meeting. To fully appreciate all of the information, you may view tonight's meeting on Chelmsford Telemedia/ YouTube. Ms. Gump shared that the school nurses will continue to work with families who have particular needs in relation to COVID.

Members of The School Committee shared their thoughts on how to move forward regarding the face-covering policy.

Mr. Moses motioned to adopt the updated MASC Policy for EBCFA effective February 28, 2022. Mr. Doherty seconded. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carries 5-0.



## Chelmsford Public Schools General Fund Operating Budget Overview

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) tracks budgeted and actual spending in districts from year to year. DESE's most recently published actual figures are for FY2020, which ended June 30, 2020. From the reported and audited actual figures for each district, DESE determines each district's compliance with its net school spending obligation in dollars and in percentage of required spending. DESE annually publishes required net school spending and actual net school spending for each district in Massachusetts. In FY2020, 11 districts spent less than their required net school spending as computed by DESE; 307 districts exceeded their required net school spending. Chelmsford exceeded its required net school spending by 34.3% in FY2020, which is above the state median value of 30.8%. Across the state, 173 communities spent less than Chelmsford, whereas 144 communities spent more than Chelmsford as a percentage of total spending in excess of required net school spending, as illustrated in the graph below.



#### What Is Net School Spending?

The Massachusetts school finance statute, Chapter 70 of the General Laws, establishes an annual net school spending requirement for each school district. Net school spending includes each town school department's general fund expenditures (operating budget) as well as the

town's direct spending for schools, but it excludes capital expenditures, transportation, grants, and revolving funds. Required net school spending is the annual *minimum* that must be spent on schools, including carryover from previous years. As stated previously, Chelmsford exceeded its required net school spending requirement by 34.3% in FY2020 and in FY2021 is budgeted to exceed its required net school spending requirement by 36.3%.

To determine net school spending for the upcoming school year, the state uses school department enrollment data as of October 1 of the current school year (i.e., the October 1, 2021 student headcount is the basis for determining the FY2023 foundation budget and net school spending requirement). This is called foundation enrollment and is used to calculate the district's foundation budget. The foundation budget is the state's estimate of the *minimum* funding level needed in each district to provide an adequate educational program.

Massachusetts uses a complex formula that considers many factors, including each district's grade-level configuration, programs, and demographics. The formula also considers each community's relative wealth and determines each community's "required local contribution" toward the educational program.

#### **Comparable Community Analysis: Demographic Data**

Although it is important to compare Chelmsford to the state average with regard to spending and academic performance, it is also necessary to assess Chelmsford's academic performance with its most comparable peer communities across the state. Table I provides general demographic data for Chelmsford and its ten most comparable districts as determined by DESE.

With regard to the number of economically disadvantaged students enrolled, Chelmsford falls in the top third of its most comparable districts. Two districts have a higher percentage of students and eight districts have a lower percentage of students designated economically disadvantaged. Some 14.7% of all Chelmsford Public School students are identified as economically disadvantaged. This is a significant increase from just a few years ago (2014-15) when 8.2% of all Chelmsford Public School students were identified as economically disadvantaged.

With respect to the number of students identified with disabilities (SWD), Chelmsford falls in the top third of its most comparable districts. Of all Chelmsford Public School students, 16.6% have disabilities and require special education services, as outlined in their Individual Education Plan (IEP). Nine districts have a lower percentage of students and one district has a higher percentage of students identified with disabilities.

The percentage of students classified as English language learners (ELL) in the Chelmsford Public Schools is higher than seven, and less than three of its ten most comparable communities. In Chelmsford, 4.2% of all students are classified as ELL.

#### **Comparable Community Analysis: Financial Support**

Within the last few years, DESE has tried to make district and school demographic and performance data more accessible to district staff and the general public. The District Analysis and Review Tools (DARTs) provided by DESE allow users to track and analyze data over time to make comparisons to state and comparable districts. The DARTs select the ten most comparable school districts in the state based on student enrollment characteristics, special populations, and grade-span groupings (i.e., K–12, elementary, secondary). Grade-span groupings are an important point of comparison because districts are often compared with their neighbors based solely on geography. However, a district's comparison to similar districts across the state is often more valuable when balancing programs and services against level of spending and student achievement.

Table II highlights actual net school spending in FY2020 as a percentage of required net school spending for the ten most comparable districts to Chelmsford, as determined by DESE.

Table II shows that three comparable districts (Shrewsbury, Bridgewater-Raynham, and Melrose) spent less than Chelmsford in FY2020 as a percentage in excess of the district's required net school spending. Seven comparable districts (Burlington, Westborough, Wakefield, Natick, Milton, Walpole, and Arlington) spent more than Chelmsford in FY2020 as a percentage in excess of the district's required net school spending. In addition to the ten comparable districts as determined by DESE, the FY2020 state median is listed at 25.4% as a percentage in excess of required net school spending.

DARTs also analyze other aspects of comparable districts, including staff-to-student ratios. DESE reports the most recent staff-to-student data for FY2021, which ended June 30, 2021. Table III presents the overall student-teacher ratio in Chelmsford, its ten most comparable districts as determined by DESE, and the state average.

Table III shows that among its most comparable districts in the state, Chelmsford's student-teacher ratio is better than five of its peer communities (Walpole, Melrose, Milton, Shrewsbury, and Bridgewater-Raynham). However, five of its peer communities (Burlington, Westborough, Natick, Arlington, and Wakefield) have a better student-teacher ratio than Chelmsford. The average student-teacher ratio among all Massachusetts school districts is also lower than Chelmsford's. Even though Chelmsford has had an enrollment decline of 451 students in its foundation enrollment between FY2008 and FY2021, its current student-teacher ratio is still higher than the state average.

The student-teacher ratio is helpful for gauging a district's overall standing with regard to its comparable communities, but it does not give a true picture of the district's student-teacher ratio. This calculation takes all students reported on the October 1 headcount and divides them by the number of teachers in the district. The ratio does not consider special programs with lower-than-average class size (i.e., self-contained special education programs). At the regular meeting of the Chelmsford School Committee on December 7, 2021, grade-by-grade breakdowns of student enrollment at each elementary and middle school in the district were reported. These figures are more useful for budgeting purposes because they depict actual homeroom class size. The October 1, 2021 student enrollment report is included as Appendix A.

Another measure commonly referred to when reviewing spending among school districts is average teacher salaries. Table IV lists the data for each comparable district and the state. These data show that Chelmsford's average teacher salary is higher than one of its peer communities (Melrose) and lower than nine peer communities (Burlington, Bridgewater-Raynham, Milton, Walpole, Wakefield, Westborough, Shrewsbury, Arlington, and Natick). The average teacher salary for all school districts in the state is higher than Chelmsford's average.

Another measure often used to compare districts is the amount of money spent to educate each student in the district, often referred to as the per-pupil expenditure. This cumulative figure includes all district expenditures on administration; instructional leadership; teachers; teaching services; professional development; instructional materials and equipment (including technology); guidance, counseling, and testing services; pupil services; operations and maintenance; and employee benefits. Table V presents the FY2020 in-district per-pupil expenditure for each of Chelmsford's comparable districts.

DESE provides the per-pupil expenditures for in-district students. As Table V shows, six of our comparable districts (Burlington, Westborough, Wakefield, Walpole, Natick, and Arlington) spent more overall per pupil than Chelmsford, and four comparable districts (Milton, Shrewsbury, Bridgewater-Raynham, and Melrose) spent less. The median per-pupil expenditure for all districts in the state is \$2,363 higher than Chelmsford.

#### Conclusion

The Chelmsford Public School District provides an exceptional education to the students entrusted to our care. The district effectively uses the resources appropriated annually by Town Meeting to serve the needs of an ever-diversifying student population. Although Chelmsford exceeds minimum net school spending on public education, and spends slightly more than the state average of district spending above net school spending, Chelmsford spends \$ 2,363 less per-pupil than the state median per-pupil expenditure statewide. In Chelmsford, average teacher salaries are lower and student-teacher ratios are higher than the state average, but they are in the low- to mid-range of comparable districts. Per-pupil spending is lower than the state average but in the mid-range of per-pupil spending in comparable districts.

Additional funding would enhance the educational experience of Chelmsford students, but the programs and services currently provided yield exceptional results, as demonstrated by standardized testing measures. Overall, our students' academic achievement makes it clear that the town of Chelmsford is receiving a positive return on its investment in public education. Chelmsford's students are also involved in athletics, community service, and fine and performing arts, thereby fulfilling the roles of productive and valued members of the community.

#### **FY2023 Budget Overview**

Several budget assumptions underlie the FY2023 budget. The town manager has included a \$ 2.5 million increase in funding for the Chelmsford Public Schools, an increase from \$ 65 million to \$ 67.5 million in the Town of Chelmsford FY2023 general operating budget. Following is a list of the assumptions that have been incorporated in the FY2023 superintendent's recommended budget.

 All FY2023 salaries have been increased in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining and individual employment agreements. "Step" increases and "lane changes" have been incorporated in the FY2023 recommended budget figures. Anticipated teacher vacancies from announced retirements have been budgeted at \$62,872 (Step 3 on the master's degree salary schedule). Most collective bargaining agreements expire on June 30, 2022. Funds have been reserved for collective bargaining in the FY2023 recommended budget.

The FY2023 budget further supports students and families in a few significant ways through additional staffing and program offerings targeted in high-need focus areas:

- The FY2023 budget provides staffing to launch an in-district Language Based Program at the middle school level (initially 5<sup>th</sup> grade) an inclusive, targeted and supportive learning environment for students who require specific and intensive remediation due to language-based reading disabilities. The goal of the language-based program is to continue to develop literacy skills and strategies while supporting access to grade level curricula for students who require a multi-sensory approach to support their reading, writing, listening, speaking and organizational skills.
- The FY2023 budget adds 2.0 Special Education Teacher positions at Chelmsford High School, 1.0 in the PAVE Program and 1.0 in the STEP Program, to provide required services in accordance with students' Individual Education Plans (IEP) and to address the increased service level needs of our students.
- The FY2023 budget increases from .5 to 1.0 the second school psychologist position at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools, to provide required services in accordance with students' Individual Education Plans (IEP) and to address the increased service level needs of our students.
- The FY2023 budget adds 3.0 social worker/family counselor positions to work with identified struggling students and their families to identify and facilitate access to out-of-school counseling and mental health services required to reengage in learning. These positions will serve the elementary, middle and high school levels of the district.
- The FY2023 budget increases the day-to-day substitute teacher rate, day-to-day substitute paraprofessional/recess aide rate, long-term substitute teacher rate, and day-to-day substitute nurse rate to be competitive with surrounding communities and attract the best possible candidates to the Chelmsford Public Schools to fill these important positions on a daily basis.

The FY2023 budget includes funding for the fourth and final year of implementation of the 1:1 computer initiative for all incoming 5<sup>th</sup> grade students at McCarthy and Parker Middle Schools and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students at Chelmsford High School. Each student will be provided with a district-provided computer (Chromebook) for use at home and in school.

The FY2023 superintendent's recommended budget continues to include Circuit Breaker, School Choice, and the CHIPs Revolving Fund as revenue offsets in support of the Chelmsford Public Schools.

The superintendent's recommended FY2023 budget was crafted in support of the district's academic and social emotional goals and initiatives that have been and will continue to be the focus of our collective work in the years to come.

On January 31, 2022, Town Manager Cohen released his recommended FY2023 budget for the Town of Chelmsford. Included in his recommended budget is a \$ 2.5 million increase, \$ 65 million to \$ 67.5 million, to support the Chelmsford Public Schools. I will be working closely with the schools on enrollment projections, especially the middle schools and high school, as they complete their course registration and selection process for 2022/23. I look forward to working with the school committee to review and present to town meeting an FY2023 local operating budget for the Chelmsford Public Schools that not only maintains the integrity of the programs and services we offer, but continues to align our available resources to meet the identified district goals and objectives for the 2022/23 school year.

I have also attached an updated enrollment projection performed by NESDEC. ### **Enrollment Summary**

The global pandemic continues to influence our nation's public health and economic stability in unpredictable ways. As such, it is still too early to identify many of the factors that could impact school enrollments. Over the past school year, we have seen fluctuations in the real estate market and job trends, which have impacted student attendance patterns. Moreover, during the past school year, we have seen how school enrollment patterns can differ substantially from one district to another, with some districts losing students while others experience an influx of students.

We are pleased to send you the past, present, and projected enrollments for your District. New this year, we have added graphs that highlight Historical and Projected Enrollments in Grade Combinations. We have received the figures given to us by the District and we assume that the method of collecting the enrollment data has been consistent from year to year.

Of note, projections are generally more reliable when they are closest in time to the current year. Projections four to ten years out may serve as a guide to future enrollments.

In light of this, NESDEC has added a "Second Semester refresher" enrollment projection at no cost to affiliates.

The NESDEC enrollment projection fell within 107 students of the K-12 total: 4,710 students projected vs. 4,817 enrolled. One variance of +48 students occurred at Grade 1, where 336 students were projected vs. 414 enrolled. This variance could be attributed to family indecision regarding the pandemic. Ratios have been adjusted.

Births decreased by -4, from a previous ten-year average of 335 to a projected average of 331, which could have an impact on enrollment of future Kindergarteners. Enrollment in Grades 1-8 is usually pretty consistent and a good predictor of enrollment stability. For the past eight years, Grades 1-8 were adding an average of +27 net "move-ins" of students in the following year.

Over the next three years, K-4 enrollments are projected to increase by +56 students, Grades 5-8 enrollments are projected to increase by +59 students, and Grades 9-12 enrollments are projected to increase by +40 students, as students move through the grades.





K-12 To 2031 Based On Data Through School Year 2021-22






K-12, 2011-2031



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### **Historical & Projected Enrollments in Grade Combinations**





From 2018 to 2029, the U.S. Department of Education anticipates changes in PK-12 enrollment of +3.3% in the South; +0.9% in the West, -1.8% in the Midwest; and -2.6% in the Northeast.

Although most New England districts are seeing a decline in the number of births, NESDEC's experience indicates that the impact on enrollment varies from one district to the next. Almost half of New England Districts have been growing in PK-12 enrollment, and a similar number are declining (often in rural areas), with the other districts remaining stable.

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### **Reliablity and Use of this Document**

#### PROJECTION METHODOLOGY

Cohort component (survival) technique is a frequently used method of preparing enrollment forecasts. NESDEC uses this method, but modifies it in order to move away from forecasts that are wholly computer- or formula-driven. Such modification permits the incorporation of important, current district-specific information into the generation of enrollment forecasts (such as in/out-migration of students, resident births, HUD-reported building permits, etc.). Percentages are calculated from the historical enrollment data to determine a reliable percentage of increase or decrease in enrollment between any two grades. For example, if 100 students enrolled in Grade 1 in 2018-19 increased to 104 students in Grade 2 in 2019-20, the percentage of survival would be 104%, or a ratio of 1.04. Ratios are calculated between each pair of grades or years in school over several recent years.

After study and analysis of the historical ratios, and based upon a reasonable set of assumptions regarding births, migration rates, retention rates, etc., ratios most indicative of future growth patterns are determined for each pair of grades. The ratios thus selected are applied to the present enrollment stastics to project into future years. The ratios are the key factors in the reliability of the projections, assuming validity of the data at the starting point.

#### RELIABILITY OF ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS

Projections can serve as useful guides to school administrators for educational planning. Projections are generally most reliable when they are closest in time to the current year, and the more stable the variables noted above, the easier and more reliable the projections. Projections six to ten years out may serve as a guide to future enrollments and are useful for facility planning purposes, but they should be viewed as subject to change, given the likelihood of changes in the underlying assumptions/trends.

Projections that are based upon **the children who already are in the district** (the current K-12 population only) will be the most reliable; the second level of reliability will be for those children already **born into the community but not yet old enough to be in school.** The least reliable category is the group for which an estimate must be made **to predict the number of births**, thereby adding additional uncertainty. See these three multi-colored groupings on the "Projected Enrollment" slide/page.

Annual updates allow for early identification of recent changes in historical trends. When the actual enrollment in a grade is significantly different (higher or lower) from the projected number, it is important (yet difficult) to determine whether this is a one-year aberration or whether a new trend may have begun. In light of this possibility, NESDEC urges all school districts to have updated enrollment forecasts developed by NESDEC each October. This service is available at no cost to affiliated school districts.
